
BACKGROUND

KNOWLEDGE INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM

Canada and Ontario are making infrastructure investments of almost \$1.5 billion in capital projects at colleges and universities across Ontario.

Through the federal Knowledge Infrastructure Program and the 2009 Ontario budget, both governments are moving quickly to help modernize facilities and boost long-term research and skills training capacity at provincial colleges and universities.

This funding is part of almost \$800 million in capital funding the McGuinty government is allocating to colleges and universities this year – a boost to the \$780 million the province originally committed in its 2009 budget.

The Knowledge Infrastructure Program is a two-year economic stimulus measure to enhance infrastructure at postsecondary institutions across Canada. This program supports deferred maintenance, repair and expansion projects to improve existing campus infrastructure.

Projects were awarded support based on their ability to quickly and effectively generate economic activity and support job creation, as well as their ability to enhance research capacity, attract new students and provide a better educational experience.

The program will also have a positive effect on the environment by reducing energy use and greenhouse gas emissions and improving waste management.

Through the 2009 Ontario Budget “*Confronting the Challenge: Building Our Economic Future*,” the province is investing \$32.5 billion in infrastructure for the province of Ontario over the next two years, including a \$5 billion contribution from the federal government, that will support more than 300,000 jobs and strengthen Ontario’s economy.

Ontario’s infrastructure investments have created more than 36,000 new spaces for students in postsecondary institutions across the province.
