

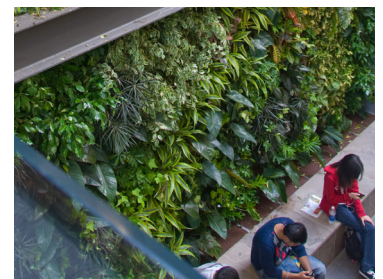


LEED® Platinum Building Signature Spaces

Environment 3, one of only a handful of targeted LEED Platinum public buildings in Canada, offers unique and distinctive naming opportunities. Donors who name spaces or features outlined below will be prominently recognized within the building and will also be eligible for additional individually tailored benefits.



Opportunity	Signature Space Description	Value
Several Unique Spaces	We would be pleased to speak with you about individually tailored naming opportunities at this level.	\$1 Million+
Atrium & Lecture Hall	A welcoming, four-story atrium is the heart of the new building. Topped by skylights and punctuated by a feature staircase and living wall, it is a key public meeting area for up to 300 people. Adjoining lecture hall seats 150, complete with video conferencing capabilities.	\$1 Million NAMED
Design Studio	A bright and spacious Design Studio spans the 2nd floor of Environment 3, overlooking green space and our constructed wetlands. Students benefit from an abundance of workspace and natural light; the perfect creative environment for large-scale and group projects.	\$500,000 1 available
Garden Patio & Green Rooftop	The third-floor Garden Patio is surrounded by rooftop gardens on three sides. Planted with species adapted to local climate and soil conditions, these drought-resistant gardens will provide a hands-on learning opportunity for students.	\$250,000 1 available
EV1 Courtyard	This traditional meeting place for environment students, staff and faculty will be remodeled and updated to ensure great gatherings can take place for years to come.	\$250,000 1 available
Solar Roof System	A solar farm will supply 60,000 kWh/year of power to minimize energy use.	\$150,000 1 available
Large Seminar	These generous seminar rooms provide much-needed teaching space and meeting space for internal and external groups of 50-60 people. One on the 3rd floor and one on the 4th floor.	\$150,000 only 2 left
Living Wall	A beautiful green wall adorns the central atrium, spanning two levels. It is connected to the HVAC system, acting as a living air filter, removing harmful substances and circulating fresh air to the entire building.	\$100,000 1 available
Ecology Lab	A new lab in EV1 will be a valuable resource for everyone in the Faculty of Environment.	\$100,000 1 available





Opportunity	Signature Space Description	Value
Feature Staircase	An open, feature staircase with handrails made from bamboo (a rapidly renewable material) spans all four floors of the central atrium.	\$75,000 1 available
Garden Courtyards	Two sky-lit garden courtyards on the 4th floor provide bright, functional meeting space for 30-40.	\$75,000 only 1 left
Executive Style Meeting Rooms	Roomy conference rooms provide comfortable space for meetings of 12 - 15 people. There are two on the 4th floor and one on the 3rd.	\$75,000 3 available
School of Planning Foyer	Staff, faculty and visitors enter the School of Planning through this highly visible entry point.	\$50,000 1 available
SEED Foyer	The SEED lobby provides reception space for guests visiting the School of Environment, Enterprise and Development.	\$50,000 1 available
Café	A bustling café offers fair-trade coffee and sustainable, locally-sourced fare.	\$50,000 NAMED
South Garden & Teaching Circle	A lovely garden space incorporating native plantings, a winding pathway and a central sitting area or "teaching circle" complete with rock seating.	\$50,000 1 available
Student Common	These windowed spaces with soft seating provide comfortable meeting and social space for students. There is one on the 3rd floor and one on the 4th.	\$25,000 2 available
3rd Floor Seminar Rooms	These cozy seminar rooms are ideal for small classes, study groups or group projects for 25-30 students. Both are on the 3rd floor.	\$25,000 2 available
Student Project Rooms	These study and project areas provide functional space for 10-15 students. There are four on the 4th floor and two on the 3rd.	\$25,000 6 available
Graduate Study Offices	Three offices on the 3rd floor and three on the 4th provide dedicated work space for graduate students in the Faculty of Environment to work, study and conduct research.	\$10,000 6 available
Bioswale & Footbridge	An important teaching concept, this area is designed to mimic a true bioswale by storing the maximum amount of water in plants, river rock and sand along the bottom.	\$10,000 NAMED
Bike Garden Bicycle Rack	A unique 'Bike Garden' for up to 25 bikes provides an interesting and functional sculpture to adorn.	\$10,000 1 available
