 - We had not looked at this previously but will be open to including people if space is available

Presentation from Dean Chesney

- Working Group for Student Transition
 - Orientation has recently changed significantly
 - There has also been an increase of awareness in the importance of the transition to university
 - Attempting to streamline practices around transitions across campus
 - Arts Faculty has instituted a working group to house planning for transitions (from acceptance to the end of first year)
 - Trying to create a better focus on the transition period past orientation
 - Working group tasked with providing support and resources as necessary relevant to new student success and transition
 - Looking for students to come to the next meeting on Tuesday, particularly first year but all student years are welcome, to reflect upon their orientation experience and anything else they want to share about their experience as a new student at the University of Waterloo
- Update on Hagey Hall expansion
 - Progressing well
 - Will be a space for students food available, seating, study and social areas
 - The food has not been finalized but it will not be a repeat of Liquid Assets, it will also likely be open later in the evenings



- Spaces will be bookable by students
- o Furniture is the next thing on the list, analyzing the space to see what fits
 - Will be flexible and easily moved around (longue on the first floor, boardroom upstairs)
- Are there any questions?
 - Are transfer students included in the transition discussion?
 - Yes
 - Are outlets being considered in the space?
 - Outlets are approximately every 6 feet, if not closer
 - There may even be some sort of digital feature
 - This is a space for students, this is taken very seriously, it must be accessible and useful to students
- The orientation schedule will necessitate performing Single and Sexy to more students at a time – looking for feedback on your experiences with this play

Presentation from HeForShe

- Visiting various on campus groups to raise awareness and gather opinions
- HeForShe is a gender equity campaign on campus originating in the UN Women's Group
 - Goal to become a world wide movement for gender equity encouraging men to take
 a stand on behalf of this movement
- 10x10x10 challenges tens head of states, ten universities to sign on to the movement –
 Waterloo is the only Canadian university to have been signed on
- How do we make this campaign relevant to Arts? Arts Faculty is very diverse
- Built a website to provide information to students, including contact information and instructions to get involved
- The website also has a form that is looking for ideas to make HeForShe relevant to the Arts
 - This information will be presented to the Deans
- Orientation meeting April 6 looking for ideas from students for initiatives that the campaign should be focussing on
- Does anyone have an input now?
 - o Finding a way to eliminate the startled atmosphere when a female pronoun is used
 - Using the position of a professor to broadcast the ideas of gender equality from a position of authority
 - o Requirements to take gender studies courses



JDCC Discussion

- This club asked us for \$1500, they wanted it to cover their scarves
- Council has asked that this money went to delegate fees instead
- JDCC did not use our money to cover the delegates
- If they use the cheque now it could go into miscellaneous fees, which is what we were attempting to avoid
- What do you think about this?
 - o Are they asking for reimbursement?
 - No, they have not indicated that they are looking for reimbursement at this time
 - o Did they know that the money was supposed to go towards the delegates?
 - Yes, we were very clear about the contingencies placed on the grant
 - By allowing people to pick up a cheque this way, we are allowing them to use the cheque for anything they like – essentially this is allowing people to take advantage of the system and pocket the money they had asked for
 - We decided that they didn't need to change their clothing all of the time so the funding doesn't need to go towards that
 - o If the money was allotted for certain things, but then they didn't use it, shouldn't that just make the money null?



- It can be sympathized that money is wanted back for the out of the pocket fees, but they need to take responsibility
- o There is an expectation that you will be paying out of pocket for certain things
- o They were aware that they were getting that funding specifically for the delegates
- Not letting them pick up this cheque because they didn't use it accordingly, but allow them to submit another proposal at another time
 - That is an option
- This is essentially a breach of agreement technically we cannot put it to a motion unless JDDC is present but we wanted these thoughts to be presented to JDCC and FEDs, it is \$1500 of arts students fees that could be put to better use
- o Can we have them show us their receipts and decide what we want to cover?
 - That is an option
- We have gone out of our way to find JDCC and sit down with them, but nothing has been resolved
