Executive Reports

President

-Reminds societies to make sure they have itemized receipts when submitting cheque requests to the VP Finance.

-Puppies and Popcorn no longer includes puppies but will still happen on the 28th from 11-2 in the Hagey Hub. It will instead be called Succulents and Sandwiches. The ASU will be providing popcorn and a trail mix bar.

-By-elections were held and both positions were acclaimed.

-Had a meeting with the deans today and mainly discussed two things; the deans asked for Council's input on the matters.

Question 1: Regarding how the University handles religious conflicts with regards to examinations. There is discussion of two policy change options, one of which would expand to include accommodation for many more religions and one which would no longer accommodate any religious conflicts.

Discussion:

As it stands the university is sort of wishy-washy with accommodations being dependent on Professors' preferences, and cases coming to the Deans when a student has not received an accommodation from their Professor.

-As it stands we do not have exams on Sundays, should we also discontinue Saturday or Friday examinations for accommodate additional religions.

-Concern rose about students taking advantage of more accessible accommodations. -Difficulty of Christian based break time on the national level which complicates accommodation further.

-A member of the Council suggests having an online form which students can fill out; updating the system in order to take some of the pressure of the Deans and Professors. -Concern is raised about the potential for academic fraud. In order to regulate the volume of accommodation requests, a Council member suggests a section on an online form which only allows a student to affirm their affiliation with a single religion.

-Discussion of the possibility of designated accommodation days for students with religious affiliations; something like a dispersal of reading week type days for those students. This is countered on the basis of it being difficult to regulate.

-Requires more exam proctors.

-The Council affirms that reasonable accommodation is important.

-The Council question how the more inclusive policy has worked at York University.



Question 2: Regarding how the University can further incentivize student note-taking for Accessibility Services.

Discussion:

-Accessibility Services are trying to implementing better note taking services; the problem of a lack thereof is more so in other faculties.

-VP Communications suggested making note taking an optional EDGE experience, a valuable suggestion but it does not account for co-op students.

-A Councilmember mentions that incentives are already in place; students receiving a letter of recommendation for so many terms of note taking.

-A Council member brings up the issue of students lacking confidence in their note taking; the need to hold workshops or having the ability to work closer with Professors to understand how to write effective and useful notes.

-A Council member suggests a monetary incentive for note taking i.e., adding money on one's WatCard.

-The Council discusses the issue with Professors not sharing their lecture notes, at least with students which have additional needs.

Grant Proposals

Economics Society's Alumni X Student Social Grant Proposal

Proposal: Economics Society is requesting \$300 in order to fund their Alumni X Student social, using the grant for food. As the Alumni X Student social will consume most of the society's budget, based on projected costs from last year, the grant will be used primarily to cover future costs for the term. The event is valuable in its ability to improve understanding a means of succeeding in the field for students, as well as to better integrate students in the program, and to strengthen relationships with alumni. **Questions:**

PSSA asks if the Economics Department would cover the cost of the venue for the event (Graduate house) as most other departments do. The representative is not able to answer this question as they are a proxy there on behalf of the society. The Council asks if Economics Society has any other large events over the course of November. The representative mentions the Graduate Showcase which will take place in late November. The council asks if the society can come back to propose a grant for next event, as the Council does not provide grants pre-emptively on the basis of precedent. **Discussion:**

The Council questions the steepness of the projected costs, and wonders if there is some way for the society to reduce their costs. Human Resources Society emphasizes that there will be another council meeting in two weeks where they can request a grant if they need money for additional events in the term. Society discusses that the amount requested seems arbitrary based on the budget breakdown in the grant proposal. The council expresses concern in the bad form of approving grants for non-specific events which have not yet been determined. The council feels that grant proposal should have a more comprehensive budget breakdown.

Motion: That Council approve the above proposal.

Vote: Motion Denied

(18 Against, Legal Studies, Sociology, and History abstain)

Resolved: That Council rejects the aforementioned proposal requesting more clarity in a newly drafted proposal for next council.



Long Night Against Procrastination Grant Proposal Follow-Up

Discussion:

The Council questions the ambiguity in the provided evidence of whether emails were sent between council meetings, as some of the emails provided were student societies' spring emails. The representative from Human Resources Management Society asks if receipts may be provided based on expenses for the event which would be funded by the Arts Student Union's grant. Legal Studies Society again brings up Facebook attendance which is far lower than that of the representative's projected attendance. The society requests more comprehensive evidence to be approved based on the judgement of the ASU's executives, in order to receive the conditional additional funding.

Motion: That Council deny the approval of the additional \$100 as part of the conditional grant proposal agreement from the last council.

Vote: Motion Passes

(17 For, Executives abstain)

Resolved: The Council rejects the approval of the additional \$100 grant based on a lack of sufficient proof, and leaves final judgement up to the ASU executives if they are provided with sufficient proof prior to the event on November 9th, 2017.
