

Political Science - SOUTH ASIAN POLITICS

Applications are being accepted for a tenure-track position at the level of Assistant Professor in the field of South Asian politics within the Department of Political Science at the University of Waterloo beginning July 1, 2014.

Candidates must have completed a PhD in Political Science or a related field. The successful candidate must be able to teach in the field of South Asian politics and must have demonstrated research expertise in this area. The successful candidate should also be able to contribute to teaching needs in one or more of the department's three core streams: global governance, politics and business, and public policy and administration. Excellence in teaching is expected and candidates must supply with their application a teaching dossier, including teaching philosophy, peer and/or student evaluations, and course syllabi. In addition to teaching and service for the Department of Political Science, <https://uwaterloo.ca/political-science/>, the successful candidate will be expected to develop an active, externally-funded research program and to collaborate in the academic life of the department.

Applications must include all of the following: a letter of application describing qualifications and the proposed research program; curriculum vitae; teaching dossier; three letters of reference, and a sample of academic writing.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
