



## Tenure-Track Assistant Professor in Assurance

The School of Accounting and Finance in the Faculty of Arts at the University of Waterloo invites applications for a tenure-track, Assistant Professor position in Accounting -Assurance with an anticipated start date of July 1, 2027. In the case of an exceptional candidate, appointment at the rank of Associate or Full Professor with tenure may be considered.

Candidates must have a doctoral degree in accounting or a related field by the start date of the appointment. We are seeking candidates who have research expertise in assurance (e.g., financial statement audit, internal audit, assurance services). While not required, preference will be given to candidates specializing in experimental or behavioural methods. The successful candidate will have demonstrated a record of, or potential for, both publishing research in high-quality journals and high-quality teaching. The successful candidate will be responsible for teaching courses at the undergraduate and/or graduate levels, contributing to the service needs of the School of Accounting and Finance, and developing and directing accounting research, education, and practice-relevant thought leadership. While not required, a professional designation in accounting or assurance would also be an asset.

Starting compensation in the range of \$240,000.00 to \$270,000.00 is anticipated, based on qualifications and experience. Negotiations beyond this range may be considered for exceptionally qualified candidates.

Interested candidates are required to complete an online application at our Online Faculty Application System (<https://ofas.uwaterloo.ca>). Applications received by November 1, 2026 will be given full consideration. However, applications will continue to be reviewed until the position is filled.
