## 2019 CO-OPERATIVE EDUCATION ANNUAL REPORT

Co-operative education is a hallmark of excellence at the University of Waterloo. What started with a cohort of 74 students in 1957 has grown to more than 22,000 today. Not only have we grown in numbers during this time, we've evolved to bring work-integrated learning to all students in any plan. With co-op as a foundational value in the University's history and development, it's no wonder nearly seven out of ten Waterloo students were registered in a co-op program in Fall 2018.

## A driver of enrolment growth

According to the 2019 Incoming Student Survey, 72% of incoming undergraduate co-op students would not have accepted their offer without co-op. The University has nearly four times as many co-op students as the next largest Canadian post-secondary co-op program.
