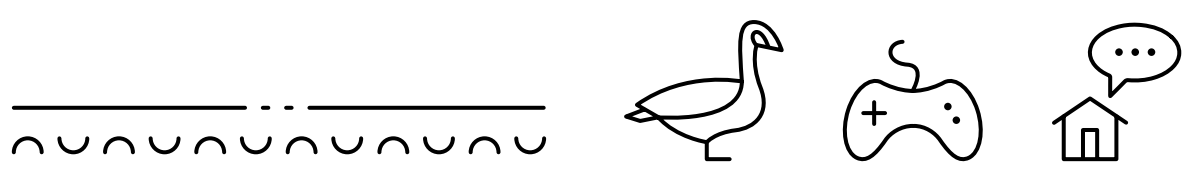

TRADITIONAL-STYLE HOUSING

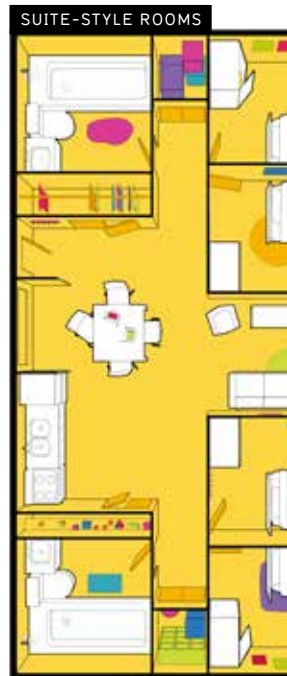

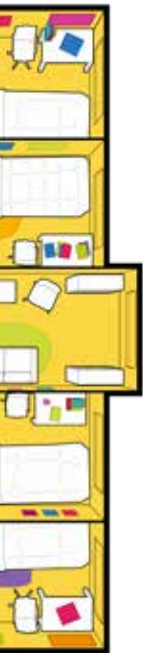

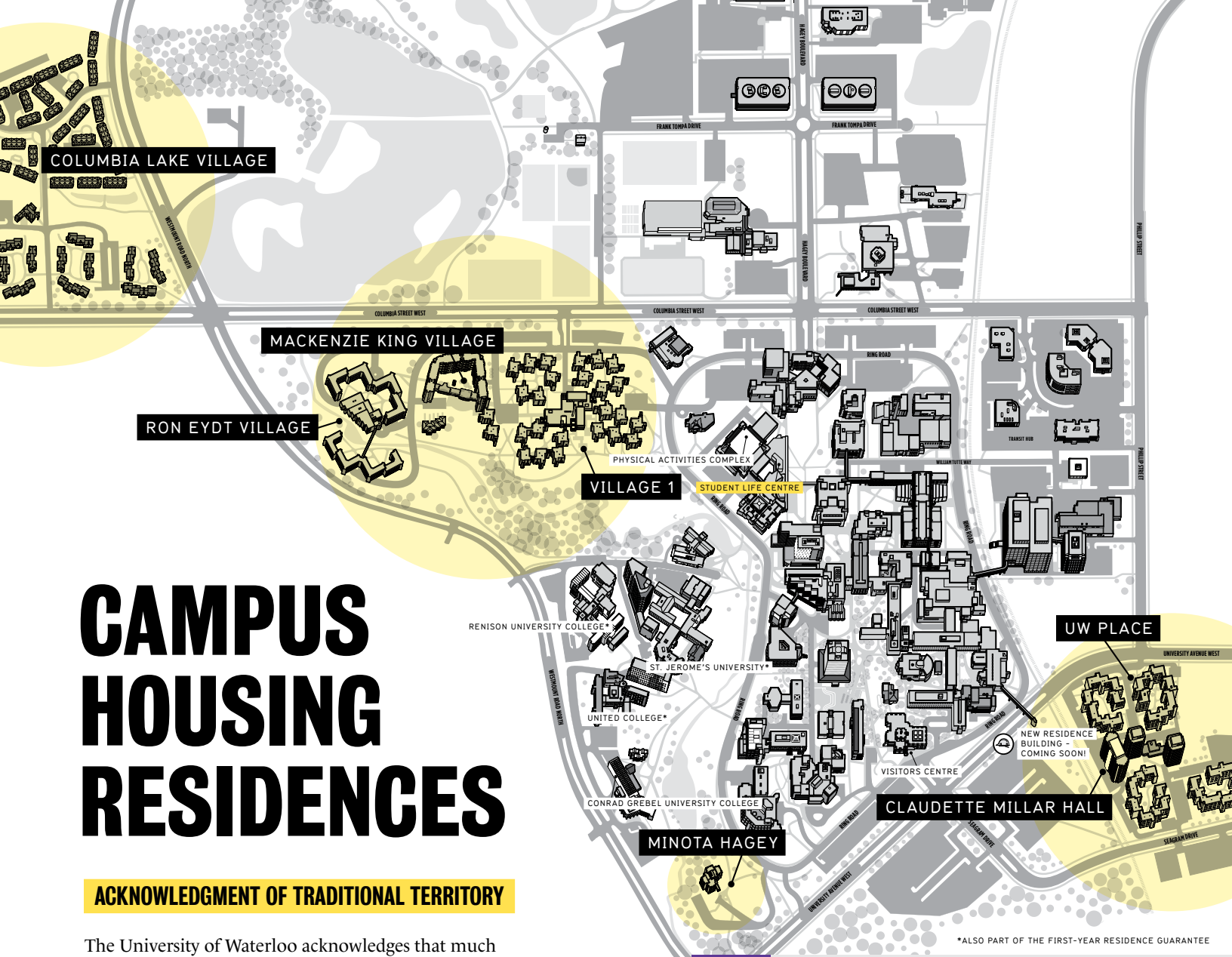
ACCESSIBLE HOUSING
