



At least 50% of jobs will change


85 million jobs will disappear...but 97 million new roles created (globally)




WHAT DOES MINDSET SHIFTING MEAN?

- Lifelong learning
 - "Hire for the *propensity* to learn" IBM CEO, Ginni Rometty
 - A recent Waterloo study shows that a lifelong learning mindset results in better performance, more promotions, and higher job satisfaction
 - Adaptability and flexibility are key
- Broad skillsets that are widely applicable
- Importance of self-clarity and on-going career development




Faculty of Health First Work Term Advice

Consider it to be an additional courseload, and plan for that!

PD1 Career Fundamentals: OVERVIEW

- Taken during student's first recruitment term
- Facilitated through LEARN Designed to take 20-25 hours per term (10 weeks)
- Pass/fail (CR/NCR) Students must receive 60% or higher to pass
- During PD1, students will develop many valuable skills including:
 - How to navigate WaterlooWorks (search for/apply to jobs, ranking, etc.)
 - Resume, cover letter and interview skills through 1:1 appointments and course content
 - Emotional intelligence in the workplace and how to apply values, skills, talents, etc.
 - Understanding co-op student responsibilities and available campus resources/supports

PD1 Enrollment/Early Access

- You will be auto enrolled into PD1 for F24
 - If your first scheduled work term is W25*
 - Auto enrollment takes place in early July; check your schedules as of July 17 for PD1
 - No need to course select/pre-enrol/enrol yourself
- Early Access to PD1 (Fall terms only)
 - Opens August 1st to allow students to get a head start, if you choose
 - There are no repercussions for waiting until September to start the course

GET TO KNOW YOURSELF

- Values, strengths, personality, interests and areas of curiosity
- Stronger application documents
- More persuasive interviews
- Provides direction and tangible work search identifiers (e.g., use skill and interest keywords to search for and narrow down job postings)
- Boosts feelings of self-worth and confidence
- Knowing and applying your strengths leads to better engagement, productivity and well-being (Seligman, 2002)



GET KNOW WHAT'S OUR THERE

- Making decisions about where to spend time/energy (learning, work, volunteer, clubs, hobbies, etc.)
- Commitment to life-long learning and skill development
 - What skills are important for me to have?
 - How can I find ways to develop and apply my skills?
- Seeking out and evaluating information
 - Conducting labour market research- talking to your RTA's!
 - Networking (leveraging existing connections and building new ones)



LEVEL UP!: ACTIVE ENGAGEMENT AND APPLICATION

- Continuous reflection of skills, interests and motivations
- Learning new things self-taught, micro-courses
- Effectively searching/using job boards
- Creating and constantly improving application documents and online presence
- Refining approach to formal and informational interviews

WHAT is your current/most recent co-op job?

HOW do you like to spend your downtime?

Myth: "My first co-op job will determine the rest of my career"

Reframe: "My first job is a great opportunity to develop transferable skills and learn what I like and don't like!"

Myth: "I don't have enough experience to get the co-op job I want"

Reframe: "I have developed relevant skills through school and life experiences. Even if I only meet ~50% of the job requirements, I should apply!"

Myth: "Co-op is ready and waiting with a perfect job for me!"

Reframe: "Job searching takes time and patience: I will need to think of it like another course!"

Myth: "I'm new to the workforce so I don't have a professional network."

Reframe: "Everyone I already know– family, friends, former coworkers – is part of my network and they can help me meet my career goals."
