

ARRANGING YOUR OWN JOB (AOJ)

Steps to arrange your own job for co-op credit

Look for a position on external job sites, through your personal connections, and at job fairs (i.e. P4E)



Once you receive a **firm**job offer, submit an
Arrange Own Job (AOJ)
form on WaterlooWorks



A Co-op Advisor will be in touch if we require more info to approve your job for co-op credit

Chat with your co-op advisor to learn more about:

- If a job that you are interested in is likely to receive a co-op credit (i.e. <u>Standard Work Term</u>)
- How to provide an employer more information about co-op (i.e. <u>fundings/tax credits available</u>)
- What options are available for you at a particular time (i.e. be removed from the interview process)



RANK AND MATCH

RANKING: PROCESS

(Employers rank students 1-10) + (Students rank employers 1-10)


How does the ranking process work? = Algorithm selects lowest sum to result in a match

- After interviews are over for each cycle, employers rank students from 1-10 and *then* the students rank the jobs/employer from 1-10 in return; employers cannot see your rankings.
- After the employers submit their rankings, you can view and submit/save your own rankings on the dates and times specified on the <u>important dates calendar</u>.
- The system adds together scores and picks lowest sum for each job to make matches




RANKING: WHAT YOU WILL SEE



Rankings Explained:

- 1 = Offer | Congratulations! Rank back a 1 and the job is yours!
- Ranked = 2-10 | They're interested in working with you!
- Not ranked = Not being considered for the role | Nothing to rank
- Blank = No action from the employer | Nothing to rank



RANKING REMINDERS!

- You must submit rankings for every job on your ranking form before the deadline closes. If you do not submit your rankings on time, the system will automatically rank every job a "10".
- If you rank the job **a 10**, it's still **possible that you'll be matched**. Think about this possibility when you are applying!
- You can submit up to 5"Not Interested" rankings per term to guarantee that you will not be matched with a job and/or prioritize other jobs of interest!
- Concerns about the job submit a <u>Request to Withdraw Application (RWA)</u>
 form immediately following an interview don't wait until the day of the ranking.
- Rank carefully! If you are matched with a job, it means you have accepted the
 position. Failing to proceed with this commitment as per the coop terms and
 conditions will result in <u>renege consequences</u>.


