




A CAREER DECISION MAKING MODEL

 - What kinds of projects/ interactions/ activities consistently motivate me? Why?










- Administration: Office of the President, Human Resources

Parallel Planning: A Diagram







What is an Informational Interviews



- What is an information interview?
 - Information gathering (i.e.., research!)
 - Intentionally growing your professional network
 - Reciprocal
 - You are offering to listen to someone talk about their success, they are sharing information with you

Using common values and interests to connect


"Hi ______, I am passionate about helping promote equity and inclusion, and I know your department at XYZ organization is a global leader in this arena. I would be interested to learn from you and get some advice on how I can make an impact in my career."

What Are You Asking?

- About their background
 - How did you get started in your field?
 - Why did you leave academia?
 - How did your degree in X prepare you for your current job?
- About their day-to-day job
 - What's your average day like?
 - What kinds of projects are you working on?
 - What skills are important in this field?
- About their recommendations for you
 - What skills, training or characteristics are important in a candidate?
 - What can I do to make my resume more competitive?



LinkedIn: Join Groups




Join groups of interest and <u>engage</u>:

How Do I Connect With Someone I Do Not Know?



- 1) How you know them: did they take a class with you, coworker, in same group, referred to you, someone you admire?
- **2) Why you want to connect**: building your network, following for inspiration, link to someone else
- **3) Call to action**: do you just want to connect, do you want to meet them, do you want them to share advice with you



Keep track of what you notice...

- For example:
 - Every time you wrap up a new project
 - Every time you've learned a new skill
 - Every time you encounter information that matters to you
- Take the time for you!





Career Planning & Gen Al: Prompts

Analyze academic background

• "I have a degree in [major or field] and my favourite classes and interest areas are [insert here]. Suggest career options that align with my academic background and interests."

Combine skills and interests

• "Identify potential career paths based on my skills in [list specific skills] and my interests in [list specific interests]"

Assess values and goals




