






WHOSE LAND ARE WE ON?



LAST DAY TO FIND WORK



- There is still **lots of time** to find a co-op job!
- Normal to go through multiple Cycles before being hired!
 - <u>February 10</u> to secure employment for a <u>standard</u> co-op credit.
 - March 10 to secure employment for a flexible term co-op credit.

YOUR CO-OP REQUIREMENTS

- Your co-op requirements are laid out in the **undergraduate calendar**, like your academic requirements.
- In order to be eligible to receive a co-op designation, Faculty of Arts students are required to successfully complete:
 - A minimum of **four** work terms. **Three** of these work terms are required to be **standard**.
 - A minimum of **four** professional development (PD) online courses
 - Including PD1 taken prior to the first work term
 - Including PD12 taken during the first work term






What can Jacob do?




