There's still plenty of time for you to find your first co-op job! In fact, for the [Fall 2026](#) work term, the last day to start work to earn a [standard co-op credit](#) is October 5 and the last day to start work to earn a [flexible co-op credit](#) is November 2.

If you...

➤ Don't know what kind of co-op jobs to apply to:
