

What is the purpose of "essay" writing?

- One part of an application to a medical school program
- Used by admissions committees to adjudicate applications
- A chance for you to communicate directly with the admissions committee
- A chance for you to say things in human words





Some conventions of this genre:

	Length variations
	Addressing and submitting the document

	Essay-style, sometimes
	First-person narrative, sharing experiences
	This is hard!
	Asking for clarification is ok!

What are the sketch writing tips?

- Decide what goes in and how you want to represent experiences
- To appeal to a wider audience, use language folks unfamiliar with the experience could understand
- Share a range of skills, responsibilities, personal growth, lessons learned, and weave in connections to CanMEDS
- Keep track of logistical info like start / end date, number of hours, and potential verifier
- Quantify where applicable to illustrate impact
- Strategically leverage space with concision, abbreviation, acronyms and symbols
- Share ABS entry with corresponding verifier


