

WHOSE LAND ARE WE ON?


The University of Waterloo acknowledges that much of our work takes place on the traditional territory of the Neutral, Anishinaabeg and Haudenosaunee peoples.







WATERLOOWORKS: GRADUATING & FULL-TIME JOBS

Job Postings

Jobs posted daily, as they are received

Recruitment

• Typically occurs in the **Fall** and **Winter** terms. Some Capital Markets/Finance employers begin recruiting in **Spring** term

Applications

- Employers will specify which documents **must** be submitted with application
- Application deadlines will vary and will be noted on the posting
- Most employers will ask that you apply direct via their external website

Interviews

- Most employers contact directly via email/phone to schedule interviews, but some will use WaterlooWorks (you will be notified if so)
- Interviews for Winter 2025 (booked on WaterlooWorks) may take place virtually or in-person

Hire someone referred by trusted colleague, friend or agency


Hire someone whose work they have already seen

• Go through your contacts and social media accounts and write down who you may want to connect with.

 - Write a message to share your qualifications and let people in your network know that you are looking for work.

3


- Build relationships
