



Each program might be a little different, but generally they ask for a combination of the following...



#### **Application Form or Portal**

- Sometimes a form, sometimes a form in a portal. Look for "Apply Now" or "Apply Here"
- Includes basic information and sometimes additional questions



#### **Letters of Reference**

- One or more
- Academic
- Professional
- Your choice



#### **Documents**


- Personal statement
- Research proposal
- Resume
- Essays or short answer



#### **Admission Tests**

- CASPer
- DAT





### What will programs look at?

Each program might be a little different, but generally they look at a combination of the following...



#### **Grades**

- GPA or average
- All of your grades or some of them



#### **Prerequisite Knowledge**

- Usually prerequisite courses
- Sometimes completed before you apply, sometimes not



### **Experience**

- Lived experience
- Research
- Volunteering
- Shadowing





SLPs evaluate, diagnose, treat, and prevent communication disorders, cognitive-communication disorders, voice disorders, and swallowing disorders



# 1. MSc or MHSc in Speech Language Pathology

- 2 years
- 4 in ON; 12 programs in Canada
- Apply through ORPAS for ON programs



### 2. CEPT Qualifying Exam

 Administered by Speech-Language and Audiology Canada





# How do I become a dental hygienist?

Dental hygienists provide dental hygiene treatments and services related to oral health disease and mouth injury prevention.



# 1. Diploma or degree in dental hygiene

- 2-3 years
- 18 in ON; 31 in Canada
- Apply through OCAS for ON programs



#### 2. NDHCE Exam

 Administered by the Federation of Dental Hygiene Regulators of Canada





# How do I become a dental assistant?

Dental assistants support office administration, support the dentist during clinical procedures, and may independently perform scoped intra-oral duties.



### 1. College certificate

- 1+ years
- 8 in ON; 40 in Canada
- Apply through OCAS or program website for ON programs



#### 2. NDAEB Certificate

 Administered by the National Dental Assisting Examining Board





### How do I become a denturist?

Denturists examine patients who are missing teeth, and can design, construct, repair and alter removable dentures.



### 1. Advanced diploma

- 3 years
- 3 in ON; 5 programs in Canada
- Apply through OCAS for ON programs



### 2. CDO Qualifying Exam

 Administered by the College of Denturists of Ontario





# How do I become a dental technologist?

Dental technologists use a variety of specialized tools, techniques, materials, and technologies to produce bridges, crowns, dentures, implants, orthodontic and other dental devices



### 1. Advanced diploma

- 3 years
- 1 in ON; 4 programs in Canada
- Apply through OCAS for ON programs



### 2. Competency Assessment

 Administered by the Canadian Alliance of Dental Technology Regulators





### How do I become a dentist?

#### 1. DDS or DMD

- 4 years
- 2 in ON; 10 in Canada; 75 in the US
- Apply through AADSAS, OUAC, or program website



### 2. Optional residency

- 1 to 3 years
- Apply through program website

# How do I become a specialized dentist?

Dentists diagnose, treat, prevent and control disorders of the teeth and mouth.

- 4 years
- 2 in ON; 10 in Canada; 75 in the US
- Apply through AADSAS, OUAC, or program website

#### 2. MSc or PhD

- 2 to 7 years
- Apply through program website

#### 3. NDSE

 Administered by the Royal College of Dentists of Canada





# How do I become a clinicianscientist?

Clinician-scientists pursue an academic career specializing in oral health research



# 1. Joint DDS/MSc, DDS/PhD or DMD/PhD

- 4+ years
- 1 in ON; 1 in QC; a few in US
- Apply through program website or AADSAS
