# FOCUSING ON WHAT WE CAN CONTROL

### INTRODUCING: THE LAMP ACTIVITY




- Begin to explore *who is hiring* who needs your skills and value
- Identify and prioritize your list of *potential contacts* (demystify networking!)
- Prioritize which organizations to connect with
- Organize the process in a systematic, manageable way

### LAMP ACTIVITY

#### LAMP stands for:

- List create a list of 40 employers who may be willing to hire you
- Alumni prioritize alumni connections
- Motivation prioritize each job using a scale of
   1-5 for motivation
- Posting prioritize companies currently hiring
  - (though you can still apply to companies not currently posting jobs, remember broadcast letters and Letter of Introduction!)



### 40 companies in 30 minutes challenge

- Who do you want to work for?
  - Most people can think to 3-5 companies
  - Those are the same companies many other students and job seekers think of first
  - This activity broadens job seekers' horizons of their possibilities
















# GAINING MEANGINGFUL CONNECTIONS

### **NETWORKING: "The #1 Job Search Strategy"**



- Regardless of your degree program stream, your career journey is a chance to build your professional network
- You can utilize both your personal and professional networks to explore the world of work: family, relatives, friends, classmates, colleagues, professors, TAs, past employers, etc.
- Networking can take many forms! Use strategies that feel comfortable for you. <u>Tip: ask for conversations, not jobs.</u>

### Connect with your contacts: a template

Greeting - Remind them who you are! "You taught my class..."

Goal – State what your short-term goals are. "I am looking for a job this summer in..."

Goods - Briefly summarize your key skills. "I have experience using Excel with strong attention to detail..."



### HOW TO SEARCH FOR JOBS ON WATERLOOWORKS





### **CHOOSE A JOB BOARD**

#### Search Postings

Pre-approved for co-op, follow Cycles

#### To search for jobs, select "Search Postings" and view the following job boards:


- Co-op Jobs > Full-Cycle Service
- Co-op Jobs > Employer-Student Direct
- Graduating and Full-Time Jobs
- Contract, Part-Time and Volunteer Jobs

Pre-approved for co-op, follow **Employer** timelines

- Job board for **graduating students** (Fall term prior to convocation)
  - Potential **flexible** work term (AOJ), **EDGE**, summer and/or part-time jobs




### "FOR YOUR PROGRAM"



- If you're a co-op student, you can filter by your program when searching for jobs
- Don't worry if this doesn't yield as many opportunities as you'd like!
  - Not all program related jobs will appear under this filter- it is NOT an exhaustive list!
  - There are many more ways to expand or hone your search

### **USING FILTERS**



#### **Keywords can include:**


- Job Titles or Categories
- Required Skills
- Location
- Job ID (if known)



#### **Program or interest-related clusters:**

- Notice which clusters are associated with the jobs you are looking for
- Take note, and create a list
- Search by cluster when job searching

### **USING NOC CODES**

In Canada, jobs are assigned National Occupation Classification (NOC) Codes based on job duties & responsibilities – these can also inform your job search!

#### **Program related NOC Codes:**

- Again, take note of recurring NOC codes while job searching
- Create a list, and search jobs federally by code

### **ADVANCED SEARCH FUNCTIONS**

- Tag filters (e.g., Research)
- Work Term
- Job Title



### **SAVING A SEARCH**

• WaterlooWorks allows you to **save your search criteria** so that you can easily search for the same thing again **AND receive an email notification** if a new job that matches your search criteria is posted.






- Click "Save My Search Criteria" and give it a title
- Select whether you'd like email notification
- Click "Save"

### TO RUN A SAVED SEARCH

- Click "Search Postings" from your dashboard and **select the job board** you would like to search
- Select the search from the "My Saved Searches" drop-down list (you may save up to 5)



### TWO MORE TIPS FOR SEARCHING SUCCESS



- Shortlist Jobs:
  - Start building a shortlist of jobs you are interested in by **clicking "shortlist"** next to those you'd like to save.
  - Access your shortlisted jobs from "Quick Search"
  - Once you apply to a job, it will remain on your shortlist
- Add unwanted jobs to "Not Interested" folder:
  - Click the trash can icon beside jobs you do not want to continue seeing as you search- this will add the jobs to your NI list
  - You will be able to **view and modify** your Not Interested list after doing this.
