WHOSE LAND ARE WE ON?


The University of Waterloo acknowledges that much of our work takes place on the traditional territory of the Neutral, Anishinaabeg and Haudenosaunee peoples.

Co-op - Working Abroad

- Over 3000 work terms abroad in 60+ countries
- Great way to build <u>key professional</u> <u>skills</u> and global work experience
- To engage in an international co-op term, you need to check your <u>eligibility</u> <u>requirements</u>
 - This takes time and dedicated planning
 - "You should complete at least one year of academic studies before applying for an international work term outside your home country" - Work Abroad Co-op




CO-OP REQUIREMENTS

- Co-op requirements are laid out in the **undergraduate calendar**, like your academic requirements.
- In order to be eligible to receive a co-op designation, Faculty of Environment students are required to complete:
 - A minimum of **four** work term credits. **Three** of these work terms are required to be **standard**.
 - A minimum of four professional development (PD) courses.
 - PD 1 must be taken prior to the first work term.
 - PD 12 is taken during the first work term.




