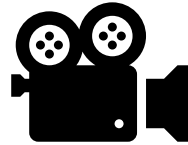



# STANDARD VS. FLEXIBLE WORK TERMS

Standard	Flexible
✓ Working with a single employer.	✓ Can work with single or multiple employers.
✓ 12-16 weeks long (i.e., May to August).	✓ Allows you to receive Co-op credit for wider range of work experiences. ✓ Part-time work acceptable.
✓ 35-40 hours per week.	✓ <b>Single</b> employer: 8-16 weeks (minimum 280 hours) ✓ <b>Multiple</b> employers: 12-16 weeks (minimum of 420 hours)

# LAST DAY TO FIND WORK




- You have **lots of time** to find a co-op job!
- Normal to go through multiple Cycles before being hired!
  - **June 15** to secure employment for a standard co-op credit.
  - **July 13** to secure employment for a flexible co-op credit. .

# YOUR CO-OP REQUIREMENTS

- Your co-op requirements are laid out in the **undergraduate calendar**, like your academic requirements.
- To be eligible to receive a co-op designation, Faculty of Environment students are required to complete:
  - ✓ ▪ A minimum of **four** work term credits.
  - ✓ ▪ **At least three** of these work terms are required to be **standard** .
  - A minimum of **four** professional development (PD) courses.
    - **PD 1** must be taken prior to the first work term.
    - **PD 12** is taken during the first work term.

## INTRODUCING JADA - Your AI-powered co-op sidekick



JADA (Job Aggregator and Digital Assistant) is an innovative AI-powered tool to support your co-op student experience! JADA offers an additional tool to find tailored job opportunities and personalized assistance for co-op students. Waterloo's Co-operative and Experiential Education (CEE) and Information Systems and Technology teams developed JADA with support from co-op students and from Microsoft Canada.

### JADA features two main components:

- **Job aggregator:** Compiles co-op eligible job postings from multiple job boards into a searchable database, helping you find potential co-op jobs that match your skills and career goals and may not be listed in WaterlooWorks.
- **Digital assistant:** Answers your questions, provides career resources and outlines information about co-op processes and your responsibilities as a co-op student.

\*note: JADA is optimized for use on desktop web browsers.

As a beta user, you can help shape the future of JADA. Your experiences and feedback are crucial in refining this tool to better serve students across our campus. Explore and provide input using the feedback tool in JADA to help us continue to enhance it to best meet your needs.

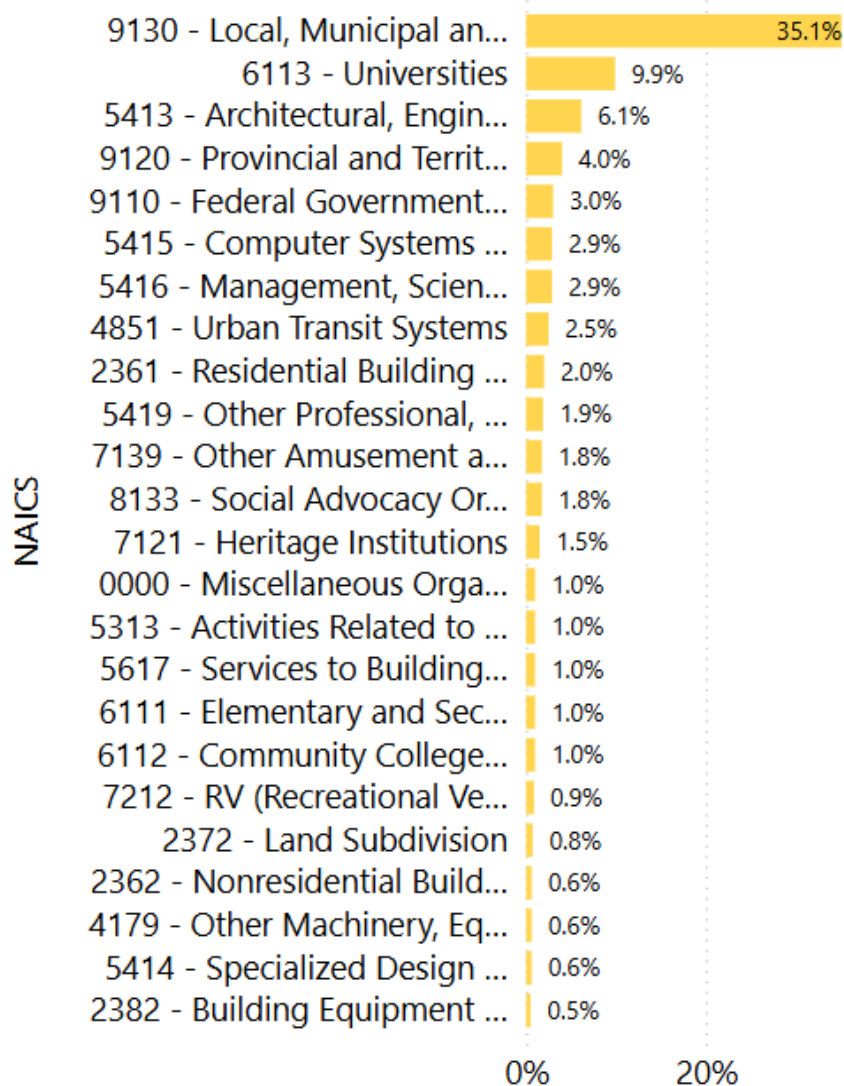

# WHAT IF I DON'T FIND A JOB?

- Stay active in the job search until the last possible date for co-op credit!  
Many students find employment after work term has begun. Check Important Dates page:
  - Last day to start work for a **Standard** co-op credit for **Spring 2026 work term**: June 15 , 2026
  - Last day to start work for a **Flexible** co-op credit for **Spring 2026 work term**: July 13, 2026
- Explore **WEAccelerate**: Opt-in program (for UG +1<sup>st</sup> WT) to gain flexible co-op credit & gain industry experience
- Minimum degree requirements (**please contact your Academic Advisor about this option!**)
- How can you enhance your transferable skills?
  - Part time job, volunteer, take a course, enroll in a course, etc.
- Work with us before you panic!
