Instructors and staff gathered on October 21 for the Fall LITE Grant Showcase, where recipients of LITE grants presented on their research projects.

Daniel Harley, Ville Mäkelä, and Cayley MacArthur—all from the Stratford School of Interaction Design and Business—presented on their project that examined the practical and experiential characteristics of using virtual reality in a 4th-year design course.

Vivian Dayeh (Biology), Brenda Lee (Physics), and Savannah Sloat (Manager, Science Indigenous Initiatives) presented on their project to implement a teaching and learning system based on an Indigenous Learning Circle methodology to better enhance student learning in STEM courses.
