

We'll also be offering two of our "signature" multi-day workshops:

The <u>Instructional Skills Workshop</u> (ISW) will be offered again on October 16–18. This threeday workshop is an intensive, collaborative, and experiential learning model that uses videorecorded micro-teaching and peer feedback sessions to support the teaching reflection and development of both new and experienced instructors. The ISW promotes participatory learning and community building and encourages examination of teaching practices, with feedback focused on the learning process rather than on the specific content of the lesson. The <u>Facilitator Development Workshop</u> (FDW) is an intensive 40-hour workshop held over 5 days that prepares participants to deliver the Instructional Skills Workshop (ISW) to others. Led by FDW Trainers from the ISW Network, the core of the FDW is another ISW with the further skills of facilitation as the primary focus. If you have completed the ISW and are interested in becoming an ISW Facilitator, please contact Richard Li to register for the FDW.

Also, join us on October 24 and 25 for multiple sessions on Student-Led Individually <u>Created Courses</u> (SLICCs). The sessions will feature University of Edinburgh's Simon C. Riley. You can also see examples of SLICCs at Waterloo.

Graduate Student Training and Resources

Is your department interested in providing training for your fall Teaching Assistants? For an overview of TA training available through CTE, visit Teaching Assistant Training: Information for Instructors and Coordinators. Some of the available training and resources

- <u>Preparing to TA at Waterloo</u> (LEARN module): A two-hour, self-paced, asynchronous module available for departments, Faculties, and course instructors to offer to their TAs. This module will be available from August 27 and throughout the Fall term.
- Workshops by request: At your request, CTE staff can facilitate workshops as part of your departmental or Faculty TA Training, in the modality of your choice.
- <u>LEARN for TAs sessions</u>: During the first month of term, CTE offers two sessions for TAs to introduce them to various LEARN tools.
- <u>Fundamentals of University Teaching Program</u>: Each term, CTE offers workshops on a variety of teaching topics relevant to TAs and graduate students that can lead to a completion certificate.
- TA Handbook: a resource of practical tips for TAs to refer to throughout their time as a TA

The Centre for Extended Learning (CEL) is hosting a four-week, online certificate course for teaching entitled **Getting Ready to Facilitate Online Courses**. Running from September 23 to October 25, this course is suitable for any current or future Waterloo teaching assistants wishing to build skills and knowledge of best practices in facilitating fully online courses.


