West Park Healthcare Centre

- Comprehensive Inpatient/Outpatient rehabilitation facility
- Operating 487 beds
- ~40,000 ambulatory visits/year
- More than 900 employees in various services
 - Clinical inpatient/outpatient
 - Maintenance
 - Environmental Services
 - Food Services



West Park Rehab Plus

- Outpatient Rehabilitation and Wellness Clinic at West Park
 Healthcare Centre
- Multi-disciplinary team
 - ~20 therapists + support staff
- Government funded rehabilitation
- Fee-for-Service health services
 - Rehabilitation & Wellness Services
 - OH&S Consulting and Service Provision



Comprehensive Staff and Patient Safety


- Nursing is the highest risk occupation for MSDs in North America
 - Majority of injuries reported are MSDs related to patient handling (multiple factors)

Components of Comprehensive Safety

- Policy and Procedure
- Best Practice Manual
- Education
- Equipment
- Continual follow-up

Program Development Process

- Continuous process of improvement
- Collaboration with staff and vendors
- Appointment of champions to specific projects



The Policy

- Individualized, step-by-step patient handling process from intake to discharge
- Multiple patient handling scenarios
- Multiple anthropometric scenarios
- Direction to other documents and resources for additional assistance



Best Practice Manual

- Comprehensive and Current
 - Compilation of current best practice techniques from multiple sources:
 - Research articles
 - Other best practice manuals
 - Presentations
 - Standards, Codes from various sources (eg: Canadian Standards Association, NIOSH,)
 - Amended by JHSC, OT/PT/Nursing best practice groups
 - Updated in 2015
 - Available to all staff for review

Education

- Targeted and Relevant
 - 1. Orientation to all new employees
 - MSD presentation to all employees
 - Back Care and Lifting presentation to clinical employees
 - 2. Back care presentation
 - Unit-specific movements/procedures
 - Problem-solving style of presentation
 - 3. Back care video (in progress)
 - Learning module-based educational video
 - Continually available to all staff
 - Produced and filmed in house

Equipment

- Safe, Simple and Population-specific
 - Equipment based on the needs of the unit
 - Amputee wheelchairs and transfer boards
 - Chronic Assisted Ventilatory care ceiling lifts
 - Functional Enhancement Molift (sit-stand)
 - Ceiling lifts on every Unit
 - Number of lifts based on population
 - Equipment-specific staff to coordinate maintenance and servicing

Equipment cont'd




- "H" rails
- Interdisciplinary communication
- Sling choice
- Equipment chosen based on feedback and needs analysis

Continuous Follow-up

- Unit-specific presentations annually
- Mandatory and continuous access to instructional videos
- Back Care Resource Person (BCRP) (in progress)
 - BCRP (RN or RPN) on every unit
 - Additional training and specialization provided by West Park
 - Challenge: maintain staffing changes



Incidences of Back Injury by Year




Overall RSI injuries by Year
