

ABOUT THE BOOK

The Gardener and the Carpenter contrasts different approaches to parenting – namely, encouraging parents to move away from thinking of parenting as a form of "carpentry," where parents shape their children into specific kinds of adults, but rather, to adopt a "gardener" approach—creating a supportive environment where children can grow and explore.



We chose this book as it drew from developmental psychology to explain how children learn best. A graduate researcher in our lab is exploring parental approaches to determine whether parents' attitudes towards their children's achievement relates to how they react to different parent-child contexts. Stay tuned for results.
