
BURSARY DETAILS:




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ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES CONTINUED:

- The SMART Training Platform welcomes applications in the following disciplines:
 - Public Heath, Epidemiology
 - Food and Nutrition
 - Primary Care and Health Policy
 - Food Science and Food Systems
 - Agriculture
 - Indigenous studies
 - Engineering
 - Economics
 - Ocomputer Science, Artificial Intelligence, Applied Math
 - Social Sciences
 - Other related disciplines under NSERC, SSHRC, and CIHR
- Students must be successfully enrolled in their home institution's Masters, PhD program or Post-doctoral Fellowship program.
- Participants must complete the following as apart of the SMART Healthy Cities Training Platform:
 - Methods Café course (offered in Fall 2023 semester)
 - Attend the annual Healthy Cities conference once during their funded term (funds are available to offset travel costs).
- Students must have a committed advisor to sponsor admission, serve as supervisor for the Methods Café course.
- Advisors can supervise more than one SMART Training Platform trainee.

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
