MYTHS ABOUT RBIO

Three myths about the crisis of the Rules-Based International Order (RBIO) need to be debunked.

SCENARIOS

The Rules-Based International Order (RBIO) clash of narratives could result in four main scenarios (or a combination of them), from least to more likely:

The dominant liberal
Marvel narrative triumphs
against alternatives that lose
steam and are marginalized as
a result of an intensification of
stigmatization. China and Russia
are firmly integrated into a liberal
international order.

There is a resurgence of multilateralism, supported by a global shift in favour of Manga narratives, and new forms of transnational solidarity emerge, supported by democratic states. 3

Marvel narratives intensify on all sides, and Manga narratives stagnate and lose steam. The world is split into distinct international orders with competing sets of rules. Marvel and Manga narratives co-exist. Because of a stalemate in multilateral venues dominated or snobbed by great powers, new minilateral initiatives

for cooperation emerge among like-

minded states to mitigate the effects

of big power rivalry and tackle

specific problems.
