This course is an introduction to microeconomic analysis relevant for understanding the Canadian economy. The behaviour of individual consumers and producers, the determination of market prices for commodities and resources, and the role of government policy in the functioning of the market system are the main topics covered. Decision making by producers in different market structures is highlighted to address profit making decisions.

Any necessary knowledge or skills needed:

Must have taken introduction to microeconomics (Econ 101). Successful completion of Econ 201(microeconomic for business and policy) is a plus.
