A Minor usually requires a student to take ten courses and a Double Degree requires even more. In most cases, this will require an Electrical and Computer Engineering student to take at least five extra courses above the regular Course Load, as some courses may count both towards the minor/double degree and towards the degree in electrical or computer engineering. As such, the student must provide a proposed plan for completing the Minor/Double Degree before graduation.

In Table 1, designate each Calendar Term as either an Academic Term (1A, 1B, 2A, etc.), a Co-op Work Term (W1, W2, etc.), a Non-Degree Term (ND), or an off Term (-). For each Term, list the courses you propose to take towards your Minor. You can be enrolled in only one additional University of Waterloo course during a Co-op Work Term and to take either one or two extra courses during an Academic Term, you must have an Overall Average of 70% and 80%, respectively. Indicate with either (TE), (TBE), or (CSE) if you intend that a course should also count towards one of your Degree Requirements.
