

Improve your academic English skills while studying at a renowned Canadian university.

English for Academic Success (EFAS) is a unique program in that it offers students more than just English language instruction in the conventional way. Students who participate in the EFAS program not only improve their English language competence, but do so in an integrated and dynamic manner that reflects what is truly needed to succeed in an academic and professional environment. The EFAS program is benchmarked to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), a global standard in English language proficiency. The program has three levels including level 200 (low-intermediate, CEFR B1), level 300 (high-intermediate, CEFR B2), and level 400 (advanced, CEFR C1). Successful completion of EFAS level 400, satisfies the English language requirement for studies at the University of Waterloo. It also equips you with the skills and strategies you need to do well on any standardized proficiency test.

The EFAS program at the English Language Institute at the University of Waterloo is a great option for a variety of students looking to improve their academic English. EFAS is ideal for students interested in studying abroad in Canada and/or meeting the language requirements for admission to undergraduate or graduate studies at the University of Waterloo. As an EFAS student, you will benefit from individualized supports, opportunities to improve your English inside and outside the classroom while gaining the skills needed for a successful university career. You may also participate in the Conversation Partner Program, which pairs you with a University of Waterloo student so you can practice your English with a fluent speaker.

The English for Success (EFS) program at Renison is an exciting shortterm English immersion program offered in June, July, and August - Canada's summer months. This program includes a vibrant social calendar with daily activities and weekend day trips designed to help you practice your English skills outside of the classroom. You will visit Toronto's CN Tower, Canada's Wonderland, and Niagara Falls (all less than 2 hours away), as well as Grand Bend - a beach town located on the shore of one of Canada's Great Lakes.

You will live on campus in residence, and participate in a true Canadian university experience. The University of Waterloo has a bustling community all year - so you will get an authentic campus experience with Waterloo students. Peer Leaders, Residence Assistants, and International Social Volunteers provide support so you can enhance your language lessons with extra opportunities to practice English.

General English at Renison (GEAR) is an interactive 4-week language program that gives you an opportunity to improve your English skills while you experience Waterloo Region and the University of Waterloo. Through approximately 100 program hours, you will develop the language skills and strategies to confidently communicate in many situations.

With classes such as presentation skills and cultural studies, you will have the opportunity to practice your English while experiencing the culture of the region and learning about advancements in many areas of local society.

As a GEAR student, you will learn more about Canada and Canadian culture through visits to on and off campus sites. Your GEAR instructors connect your experiences from these visits to your course content, giving you the chance to use English in real-world contexts.

EXAMPLES OF CUSTOM PROGRAMS

The following are examples of past, existing, and potential custom programs developed and offered by the Renison ELI.

• ENGLISH FOR SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATH (E-STEM)

The eSTEM program (English with a focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Environment, and Mathematics), is a unique opportunity for students to improve their overall English language skills while experiencing one of Canada's most innovative universities. This ten-day immersion online program is designed specifically for high school students to immerse themselves in the University of Waterloo's renowned STEM ecosystem and simultaneously improve their ability and confidence to communicate in English.

• ESSENTIAL SOFT SKILLS IN ENGLISH (ESSE)

The Essential Soft Skills in English (ESSE) program is designed for students who want to communicate effectively in English while gaining the soft skills that employers today look for including working in teams, interpersonal communication, presentation skills, and leadership skills.



ESSE courses take place entirely online, through real-time classes and self-directed study



EXPLORING SCIENCE

Exploring Science is a 3-week program that provides language practice to improve participants' English language proficiency while learning about physics, biology, chemistry, mathematics, and Canadian culture. The program includes a variety of science lectures, presentations and tours, an introduction to University of Waterloo professors, staff and graduate students, and excursions to local and regional attractions.

BUSINESS LANGUAGE AND LEADERSHIP

The Business Language Leadership (BLLP) program is a 3-week, business and leadership program in which students participate in 5 core classes as well as evening and weekend excursions. This program focuses on aspects of business such as language (oral and written), analysis, leadership, and critical thinking. As a language program, this program looks at language embedded within a local business context and the various nuanced notions of business discourse.

BLLP provides students with theoretical tools of analysis, as well as basic research techniques, in the on-site examination of actual Canadian businesses.

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Teacher professional development programming may be customized to meet particular needs and/or requirements. Customizable options include content areas such as English as a medium of instruction, educational methodologies, learning theory, and can be delivered in a variety of formats, including online, hybrid, and in-person.

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




