Hope you are all doing well! I am reaching out as we are approaching the Fall semester to update you on a few key services (for instruction and collections) that are available.

Library instruction sessions

- The library has been busy preparing for the Fall instruction for library workshops. Working with our Library's Instructional Design team a variety of online modules (that can be loaded into LEARN) have been created for asynchronous learning and to engage students with the content.
 - View our <u>Online Learning Object Repository</u>
 - Topics include: Finding e-books, understanding differences between scholarly/popular resources, peer-review, conducting academic research, Boolean searching, citation (MLA 8th edition), reading effectively and efficiently, and many other options.
- **ENGL 109** this is the most frequent English course (with a variety of sections) that our data shows to call for library instruction. As a result, I have been working with our Library Instructional Design team and have developed modules that can be incorporated into LEARN and students are able to work through the modules and interact with the content asynchronously.
 - Topics include: introduction to their librarian, finding e-books, understanding differences between scholarly/popular resources, peer-review, conducting academic research, and Boolean searching.
 - Other topics can be included or changed out if required.
- For any courses that would like library instruction, further assistance can be added such as joining discussion boards for the week of library instruction and attending synchronous discussions.
