2022-23 Annual Report of the Associate Dean of Graduate Studies

Current Enrollment:




Figure 1: Full-time Equivalent Graduate Student Enrolment in the Faculty of Environment on 1st November 2009-2022 (government count date).

Graduate Studies programs in the Faculty of Environment continue to attract high quality applications and admissions. The Dean's Doctoral Initiative (DDI) has continued into the ninth year, serving both domestic and international students. Our research clusters continue to help students identify research areas and find potential supervisors. In 2022, 128.8 Masters and 23.2 doctoral (full-time equivalent) students joined our programs, thus bringing our total complement, or student headcount, to 701 graduate students in the Faculty (down slightly from 715 in 2021). Of these, 239 are pursuing their doctoral degree, and 136 are international students. When weighing part-time students as 0.3 units, the total full-time equivalent (FTE) in Fall 2022 was 535.8 graduate students (Figure 1).

Demand




Figure 2: Number of Graduate Program Applications, by unit, 2001 – 2022

The trend in the demand for our graduate programs is similar to last year. Applications are down slightly from our historic high in 2020-21, when we received over 700 applications for both Masters and Doctoral programs. For Fall 2022 we received 629 applications (Figure 2).

Note: The above graph excludes applications for the Graduate Diploma in Social Innovation that operated for three years – an additional 42, 41 and 84 applications (this is now closed). It also excludes applications to the doctoral program in Global Governance.

Doctoral recruitment: We continue to attract high quality applicants. The Dean's Doctoral Initiative guarantees funding of \$106,848 for students across the four years. This year, the Dean's Doctoral Initiative offered 10 awards each for domestic and international students. These award recipients were selected from a very strong pool of applicants. Seven domestic and seven international DDI students entered our programs last fall, with two students deferring until fall 2023. In addition, the Faculty offers an entrance award worth \$5,000 for exceptional doctoral students.

Total doctoral applications for Fall 2022 were 135 (40 domestic), down from 143 for Fall 2021 (56 domestic). As of April 17, 2023 total doctoral applications for Fall 2023 are 104 (32 are domestic). The highlights are as follows:

- The proportion of domestic applicants has decreased since 2019 (2019 = 38%, 2020 = 39%, 2020 = 39%, 2021 = 30%, 2022 = 30%)
- As of April 17, we have made 33 offers (16 domestic), and this is ongoing. In comparison, in Fall 2022 we had made 36 offers (19 domestic).
- As of April 17, we have 26 offers accepted (12 domestic). We had the same number of offers accepted at this time one year ago (2022).

Masters recruitment: For 2023, funding packages for domestic research masters students were adjusted and are worth approximately \$17,188 to up to \$30,782. Non-thesis or professional masters students with high academic averages were eligible for entrance awards worth \$2,000 to up to \$4,000. Last year, we offered 15 IMAE awards to incoming international masters students, with 12 students entering our programs last fall.

Total masters applications for Fall 2022 were 504 (189 domestic), down from 575 for Fall 2021 (299 domestic). As of April 17, total masters application for Fall 2023 are 466, (187 domestic). The highlights are as follows:

- The domestic applicant pool in 2023 is similar to last year (2019 = 47%, 2020 = 52%, 2021 = 52%, 2022 = 38%, 2023 = 40%)
- As of April 17, we have made 220 offers (129 domestic), and this is ongoing. In comparison, in Fall 2022 we had made 199 (130 domestic) at this time.
- As of April 17, we have 147 (79 domestic) offers accepted, compared to 117 at this time last year (71 domestic)

Changes in the Grad team:

- Jason Santo served the faculty as the interim Graduate Studies Marketing and Recruitment Specialist while Christina Pope was on leave.
- This year, we welcomed Anastasiya Saparaliyeva and Jennifer Doucet as Graduate Program Administrators in SEED.

Other highlights:

- We held a highly successful week of grad studies open house recruitment events (in person/blended/online) during November 21-24, 2022.
- The Faculty of Environment was well represented at this year's 2023 GRADflix event. Our participants included; Amerald Fang (GEM), Anika Chang (GEM), Caitlin Laidlaiw (GEM), Larissa Gospodyn (GEM), Navya Nair (SEED), and Patrick Bosworth (SEED).
 Congratulations to Caitlin Laidlaw, who placed 2nd, and to all our participants.
- Note: the University of Waterloo GRADtalks and Three Minute Thesis (3MT) programs are on pause due to the pandemic.
- The Faculty of Environment and the University are continuing to respond to the many challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Although we have returned to in person programs, we continue to provide some online services to support graduate students. These online services include supporting the completion of graduate milestones, in particular PhD thesis examinations, through online delivery. In addition, we are working with the GSPA to support research students who face challenges associated with research funding.
- This coming year, we will be prioritizing the implementation of the recommendations of the President's Anti-Racism Task Force.

Special thanks to the graduate team for the collaborative work and their efforts to contribute to the Faculty's vision of delivering high quality education and enrich student experience.
