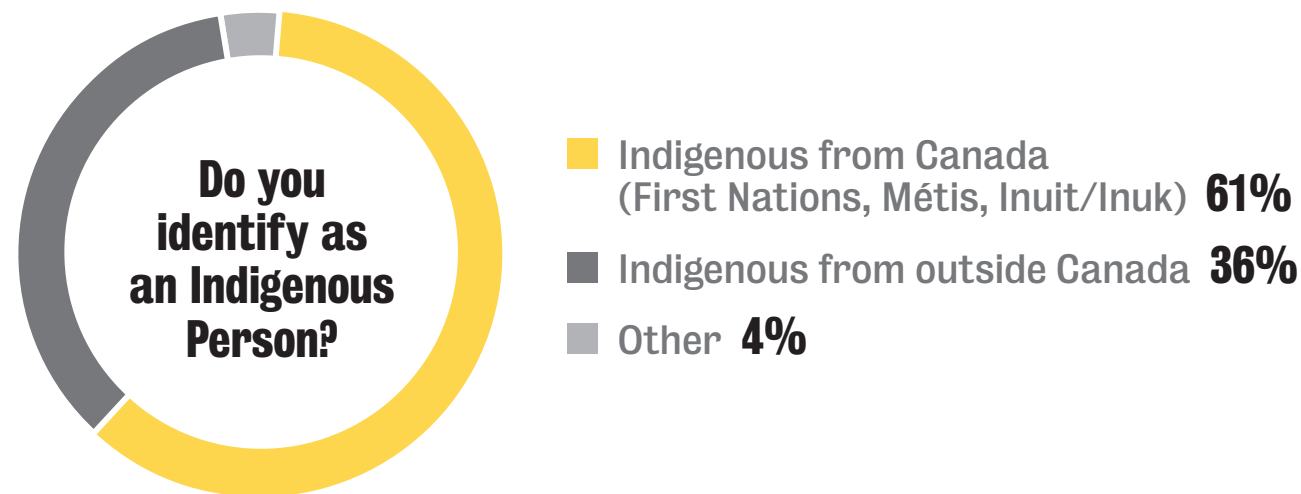


EQUITY SURVEY 2021 STUDENTS

The Waterloo Equity 2021 survey collected self-reported demographic data from June to October 2021 to help us better understand the diversity of our community.

Consistent across undergraduate (1% or n=115) and graduate (2% or n=59) survey respondents



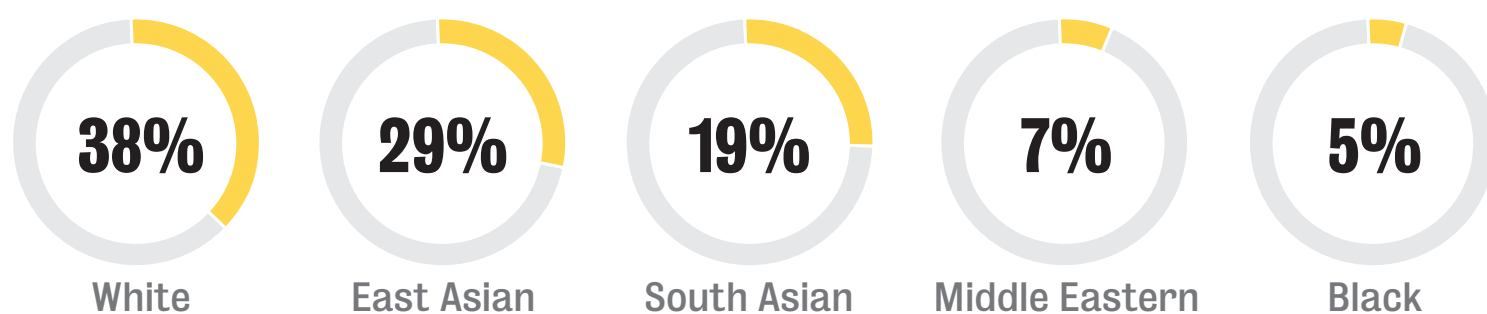
REPORTING ON INDIGENOUS DATA

We live and work together on the traditional territory of the Neutral, Anishinaabeg and Haudenosaunee peoples. Data collected on Indigenous peoples belongs to the peoples of those communities. Equity survey data related to Indigenous peoples falls under the custody of the university and the stewardship of the Office of Indigenous Relations, and is reported in consultation with them. Data is treated according to Indigenous principles, including those described by Fair and Care and the First Nations Principles of OCAP, and data management and confidentiality practices will align with the principle that identity must be protected both individually and collectively.

We acknowledge that any reports we prepare are affected by the influence of the colonial systems in which we are enmeshed. Efforts to mitigate that impact include ongoing training in Indigenous data management, facilitated by the University of Winnipeg and Kishaadigeh: The Manitoba Network Environments for Indigenous Health Research, as well as consultations about reports including Indigenous data with Indigenous Initiatives.

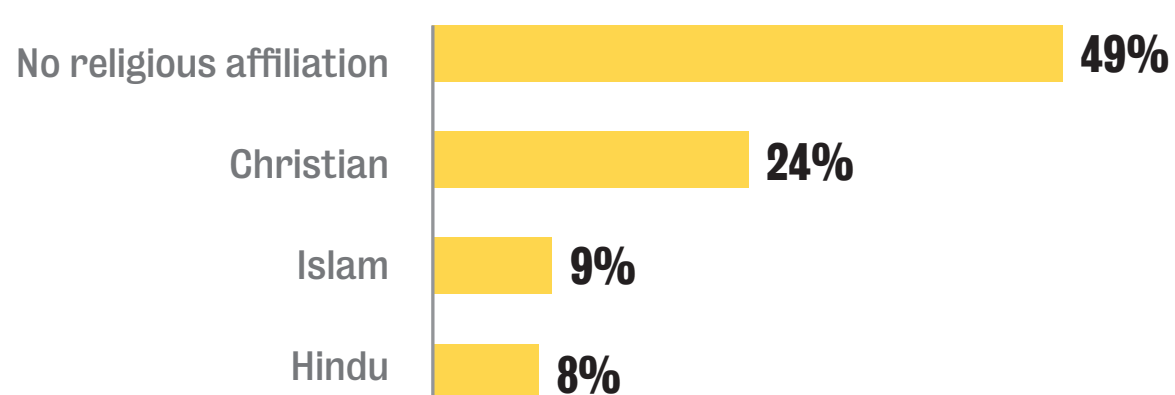
RACIAL IDENTITY*

RELIGIOUS AND SPIRITUAL AFFILIATIONS MOST FREQUENTLY REPORTED



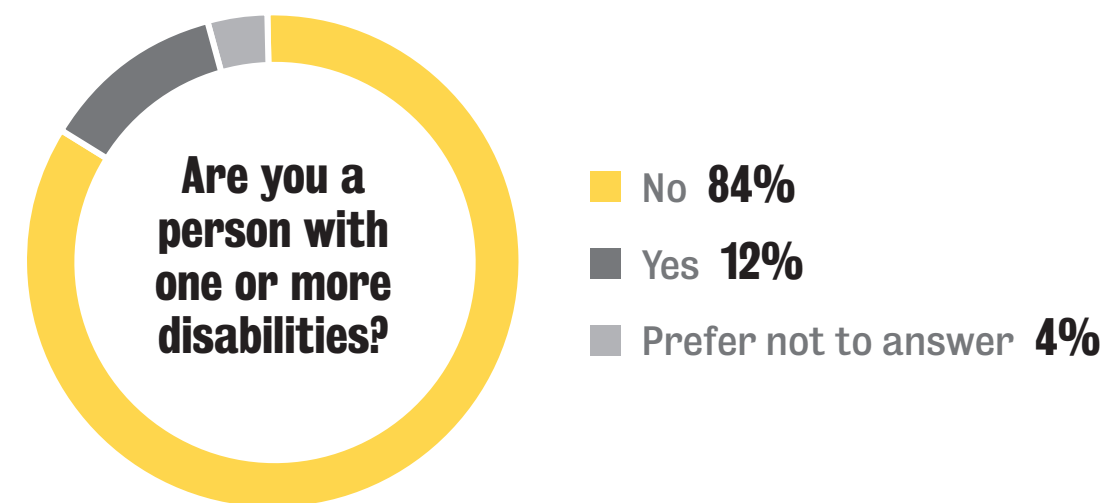
CANADIAN RESIDENCY*



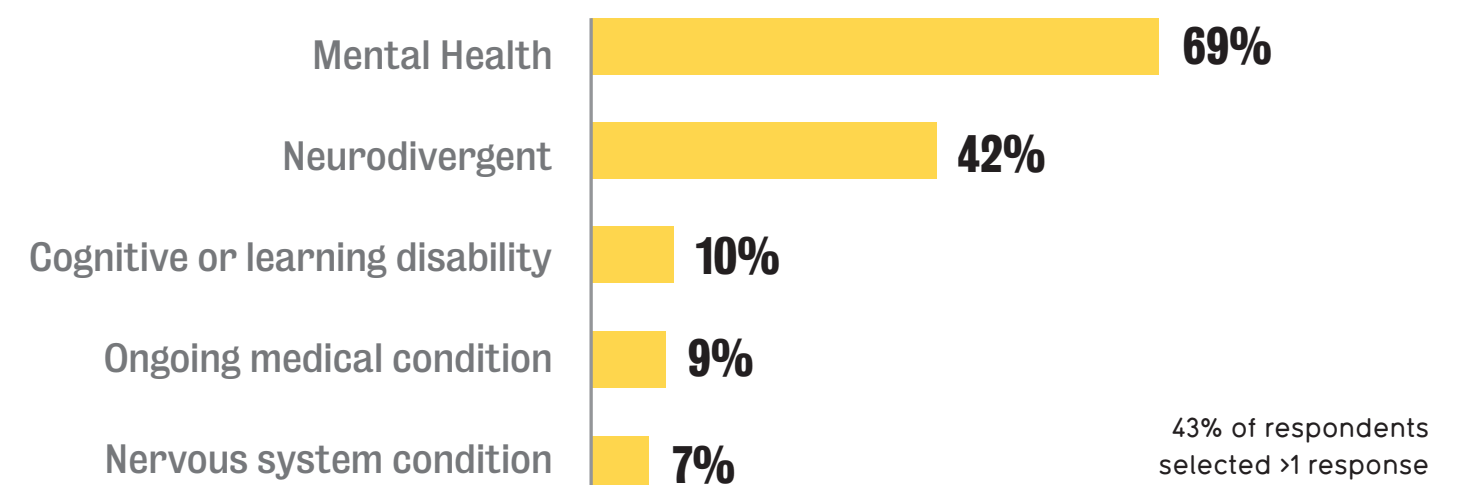
Survey results accurate to within +/- 2 percentage points, 99 times out of 100.

*Multiple response question; respondents can select >1 response option.

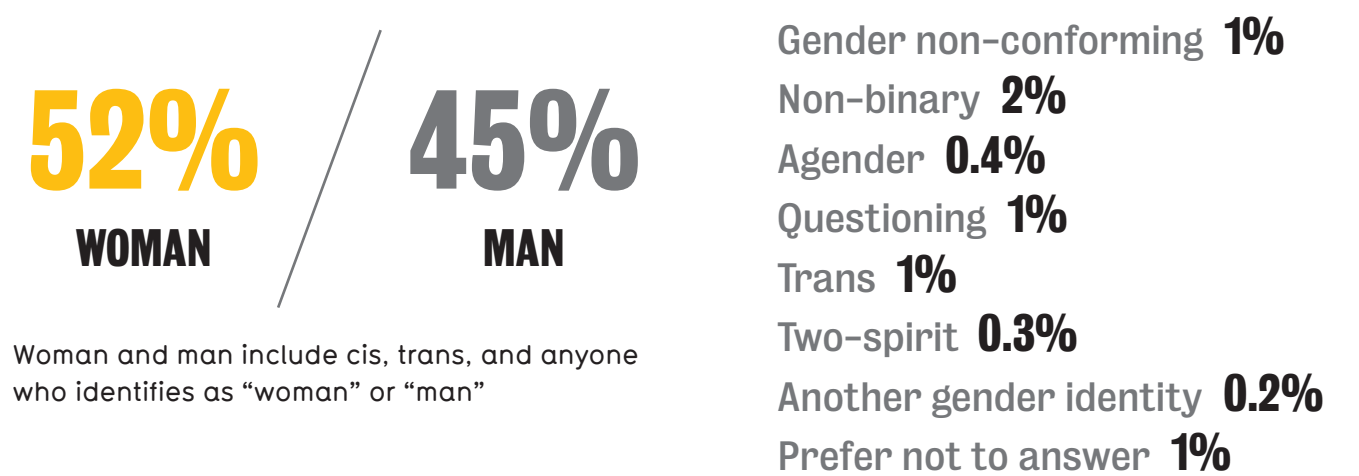
DISABILITIES*
