

## Honours Fine Arts – Studio Practice (also for ARBUS and Double Major)

Continuation in this academic plan requires a cumulative overall average of 60% and a cumulative Fine Arts major average of 70%.

Eligibility for graduation in the Honours Fine Arts – Studio Practice, Honours Fine Arts with ARBUS and Honours Fine Arts – Double Major academic plans include successful completion of the following requirements: Appropriate Program-level requirements. See Bachelor of Arts Degree Requirements.

All Honours programs are a minimum of 20.0 academic units. Most courses have a 0.5 credit unit weight, except for FINE 307s which are 0.25 units.

**Fine Arts Plan-level requirements:**

- a minimum cumulative Fine Arts average of 70%
- at least 8 academic course units in Fine Arts including: (see Note 2)
  - FINE 100, 112, 209, 319, 302, 474, 475
  - VCULT 101/FINE 101
  - at least one of FINE 222, 223, 271, 272
  - at least two of FINE 224, 225, 226, 274
  - at least two from FINE 130, 202, 204, 220, 221, 222, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227, 228, 229, 230, 231, 232, 271, 272, 274
  - at least .5 units from VCULT or FINE Art History courses or FINE 243, 343 (see Note 2)
  - at least four topics of FINE 307 (each 0.25) or a combination of FINE 307 and other 300-level studio courses, for a total of 1 units (see Note 2)

**Notes**

1. Admission to 200-level studio courses is by successful completion of FINE 100 and by submission and approval of portfolio work done in FINE 100.
2. Certain Fine Arts courses, including many 3rd-year courses, are .25 units.
3. Students must have successfully completed: FINE 319; at least four 200-level FINE studio courses; and a minimum cumulative Fine Arts major average of at least 65%. Students must be in at least 3A before proceeding to the 300-level studio courses.
4. No one course may fulfill more than one requirement within any Fine Arts plan.

## Three Different Specializations Offered in Fine Arts

### 1. Intensive Studio Specialization

In combination with the Honours Fine Arts - Studio Practice plan-level requirements listed above, students interested in pursuing the Intensive Studio Specialization will be required to fulfil the following requirements:

- A minimum Fine Arts [major average](#) of 75%.
- Successful completion of 2.5 additional academic course units, for a total of 10.5 academic course units in Fine Arts:
  - [FINE 308](#), [FINE 407](#), [FINE 476](#), [FINE 477](#)
  - one additional course from [FINE 130](#), [FINE 202](#), [FINE 204](#), [FINE 220](#), [FINE 221](#), [FINE 222](#), [FINE 223](#), [FINE 224](#), [FINE 225](#), [FINE 226](#), [FINE 227](#), [FINE 228](#), [FINE 229](#), [FINE 230](#), [FINE 231](#), [FINE 232](#), [FINE 271](#), [FINE 272](#), [FINE 274](#)
  - one additional topic of [FINE 307](#) or a combination of FINE 307 and other [300-level](#) studio courses

### 2. Teaching Preparation Specialization

The Teaching Preparation Specialization is open to all students in Honours Fine Arts - Studio. The Teaching Preparation Specialization requires successful completion of:

- four courses:
  - [PSYCH 101/PSYCH 101R](#); [PSYCH 212/PSYCH 212R](#)
  - [SOC 101/SOC 101R](#); [SOC 207/SOC 207R](#)
- a total of 100 hours of relevant volunteer or paid experience under the supervision of qualified professionals, of which 50 hours must be in the classroom setting. See the [Fine Arts website](#) for specific guidelines. This requirement must be completed before the beginning of the student's 4A term.

It is recommended that students pursuing the Teaching Preparation Specialization also complete:

- at least two different topics under [FINE 243](#) and/or [FINE 343](#). See the [Fine Arts website](#) for more details.

Students who graduate from the University of Waterloo with the Teaching Preparation Specialization are eligible to pursue a Bachelor of Education at Nipissing University in either the Junior/Intermediate or Intermediate/Senior divisions. Students who choose not to attend Nipissing University will still receive the Teaching Preparation Specialization designation. See the Fine Arts website for more information.

### 3. Digital Art Specialization

The Digital Art Specialization is open to all students majoring in Fine Arts - Studio. The Digital Art Specialization requires successful completion of six courses:
