
Saguenay:



Successfully completed courses taken at another university during the exchange will transfer as *credits without numeric grades*.

- The Registrar's Office transfers courses that have a final grade equivalent to 60% (C-) or higher.
- Courses with grades below will not be transferred.
- Credits transferred will not affect your UWaterloo GPA.

Upon completion of the exchange program, students must order an official transcript from their host university. The official transcript must be sent directly to Waterloo's Registrar's Office: 200 University Avenue West, Waterloo, ON, N2L 3G1.
