Nominating Committee Report GSA-UW Board of Directors

June 21, 2017

At its meeting on May 24, 2017, the Board delegated the search for and nomination of candidates for its two vacant seats to the Board Executive Committee.

A call for applications was sent to the membership on June 12, 2017 (Appendix A). Eight applications were received before the deadline of June 19, 2017 and were circulated to the members of the Executive Committee for review. The committee members used a scoring matrix (Appendix B) to award each candidate up to 38 points, based on their applications, and then ranked the candidates from 1 (highest) to 8 (lowest). The committee members assessed the applications independently. Following the independent assessments, the scores and rankings were aggregated, as summarized in the table below. Three of the four committee members agreed on their top two picks, while one member disagreed with one of the majority picks. Following discussion, the fourth member agreed with the majority opinion, and the Executive Committee therefore nominates Amanda Joynt and Julie Cook to the Board for terms lasting until April 30, 2018.

Interviews were not held, as the committee members were satisfied that they had enough information about the skills, merit, and fit of the candidates to make good decisions in the best interests of the Association. Furthermore, given the amount of work that needs to be done by the Board in the ten remaining months of the year, and the time that will be needed to on-board the new directors, appointing directors at the June meeting of the Board was given priority.

A member of the committee raised the possible perception of stacking of the Board with SERS/ENV students. It was noted that there might be a variety of reasons why SERS/ENV students take interest in the Association, in this and other years, but that this trend should not prevent the Board from recruiting qualified candidates. However, efforts should be made over the coming year to conduct outreach into all faculties to encourage wider interest in and awareness of the Association's governance.
