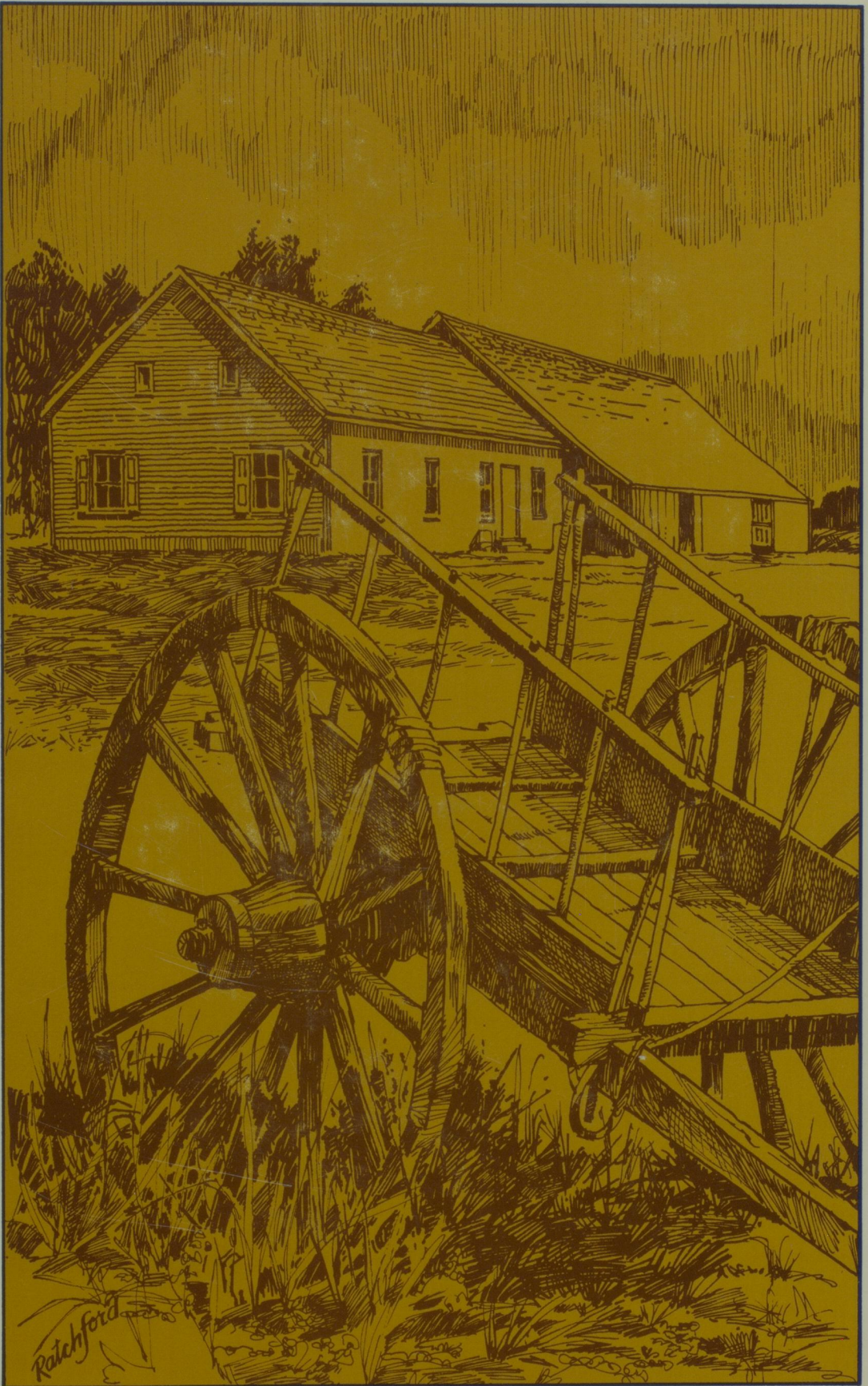

Reflecting his broad range of interest and experience, Dr. Epp's books include *Mennonite Exodus: The Rescue and Resettlement of the Russian Mennonites Since the Communist Revolution*, *Whose Land Is Palestine: The Middle East Problem in Historical Perspective*, and *A Strategy for Peace: Reflections of a Christian Pacifist*. He is currently a member of the Canadian federal government Immigration Advisory Board, Mennonite Central Committee (Canada), and the Mennonite World Conference Praesidium. Dr. Epp is President and Associate Professor of History at Conrad Grebel College, University of Waterloo.
