Would you like to learn about Indigenous issues in Canada and beyond?

In the Mohawk language, Skahne Tewaterayenstha means “we study, we are students, we learn as one.” Indigenous Foundations offers an introduction to the histories and cultures of Indigenous peoples in Canada and around the world. We will examine the histories of Indigenous-settler relations, settler colonialism, Indigenous land rights and activisms, environmental issues, and expressions of art and culture.
