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GA 188 : Pequegnat, Marcel

Marcel Pequegnat fonds. - 1868-1869, [ca. 1899]-1987, 2008, predominant [ca. 1897]-1961. - ca. 2.6 m of textual records and other material.

Marcel Pequegnat (1886-1988) was a civil engineer in Kitchener, Ontario, and spent his professional career with the Kitchener Water Commission as superintendent and consultant. He was also involved in the Grand River Conservation Commission and the Arthur Pequegnat Clock Company.

Born in Berlin (now Kitchener) to clockmaker Arthur Pequegnat and his wife Hortense, Marcel studied engineering at the University of Toronto. After graduating he taught at the University and worked for several summers for the Berlin City Engineers. In 1910-1911, he surveyed land in Manitoba, and in 1913, he was appointed assistant city engineer in Berlin. In 1919, he became superintendent of the Kitchener Water Commission, holding this position until 1957 when he became a consultant until retiring in 1970. Marcel also served for 27 years on the Kitchener Planning Board and for 30 years on the Kitchener Suburban Roads Commission. He was president of the Arthur Pequegnat Clock Company from 1940 to 1964, though for most of that time the company was dormant, having ceased clock production by 1942.

Marcel Pequegnat was a founding member of the Grand River Conservation Commission when it formed in 1932 and served as vice-chairman from 1938 to 1952, chairman from 1953-1959, and chief engineer from 1962 to 1965. His period of service with the GRCC coincided with the building of the Shand, Luther, and Conestogo dams.

Marcel Pequegnat was a Life Member of the Engineering Institute of Canada, a charter member of the Professional Engineers of Ontario, and received their Citizenship Award in 1973. He also was awarded Life Membership in the American Waterworks Association. Contents: fonds consists of records accumulated by Marcel Pequegnat in his professional roles as superintendent of the Kitchener Water Commission, vice-chairman of the Grand River Conservation Commission, and president of the Arthur Pequegnat Clock Company; and records collected by him relating to the history of these bodies. Records relating to the Kitchener Water Commission and its predecessor, the Berlin Water Works Company, span from ca. 1887 to 1961, and are mainly from 1898 to the 1930s. Records relating to the Grand River Conservation Commission cover the period from 1939 to 1943. Includes correspondence, contracts and other legal documents, reports, minutes, architectural and technical drawings, photographs and other visual material, press clippings, ephemera, and advertising material.

Series 1 : The Arthur Pequegnat Clock Company

The Arthur Pequegnat Clock Company. - [19--]-1987. - 1.5 cm.

Arthur Pequegnat (1851-1927) was a jeweler and watch repairman in Berlin (now Kitchener). In the mid-1890s, he added a bicycle repair shop to his jewellery store and then built a three-storey building on Frederick Street for manufacturing specialist bicycles, which he called "racycles". Arthur and his brother Paul established the Berlin and Racycle Manufacturing Company in 1900, and continued to produce bicycles until 1923. In 1903, Arthur also began to produce clocks in the same building, and unofficially changed the name of the company to the Arthur Pequegnat Clock Company. The company produced around ninety models of clocks until it closed the factory in 1942. After Arthur's death in 1927, his brother Leon became president and son Edmond manager; with Edmond's death in 1963, son Marcel became president of the dormant company, and the final disposition was made in 1964 when the charter was presented to the Ontario government. Series 2 : Berlin Water Works Company

Berlin Water Works Company - [ca. 1887]-1898. - 2 cm. - 2 architectural drawings : blueprint and blackline print ; 28 x 32 cm and 27 x 51 cm.

The Berlin Water Works Company was formed in 1887. At that time, the Berlin Town Council was attempting to develop a municipally-owned water works system, but faced resistance from the rate-payers. The Council let tenders for town water supply by private company and awarded the contract to the Berlin Water Works Company, which was made up of American Company Moffett, Hodgkins & Clarke, as well as Berlin town solicitor Alexander Millar. The company began construction of the water works at Shoemaker's Lake in February, 1888, and began to supply service in October that year. When the town's contract with the company expired in 1898, after another period of debate about municipal ownership, the Corporation of the Town of Berlin purchased the water works for \$102,000. The new water commissioners began their duties in January, 1899. Superintendents of the Berlin Water Works Company included Herbert J. Bowman and W. Mahlon Davis. Contents: series consists of records relating to the operation and activities of the Berlin Water Works Company and the sale of the company to the Corporation of the Town of Berlin. Includes correspondence, reports, contracts and other legal documents, architectural drawings, and other material.

Contents: file consists of a letter from Herbert J. Bowman, superintendent of the Berlin Water Works Company, to the mayor and council of Berlin regarding the extension of the water main on Waterloo Street.

File 12 **Indenture between John F. Moffett et al. and the Berlin Water Works Company.** - 1896.

Contents: file consists of a contract between John F. Moffett et al. and the Berlin Water Works Company, transferring the water works property at Shoemaker's Lake to the Company.

File 13 **Water works statistics for the year 1896.** - 1896.

Contents: file consists of one leaf of statistics relating to the revenue and profits of water works systems in various Ontario towns for in the year 1896.

File 14 **Correspondence at time of purchase by Berlin : 1898.** - 1898.

Contents: file consists of correspondence from the period of March to July, 1898, relating to the negotiations between the Berlin Water Works Company and the Fire and Water Committee of the Town of Berlin about the purchase of the water works by the Town. Correspondence, which includes originals and carbon copies, is among the Berlin Water Works Company, Karl Mueller (chairman of the Fire and Water Committee of Berlin), Willis Chipman (civil engineer and consultant on the case), Bowby & Clement (solicitors), and others. File also includes one press clipping.

File 15 **Sale of private company to Town of Berlin : 1898.** - 1898.
Contents: file consists of records relating to the valuation of the Berlin water works system and the sale of the water works by the Berlin Water Works Company to the Corporation of the Town of Berlin in September, 1898. Includes the offer of sale, drafts of legal documents including a memorandum of agreement, a valuation report by Willis Chipman (civil engineer), correspondence, and a press clipping.

File 16 **Report of superintendent W. Mahlon Davis, city engineer : Dec., 1898.** - 1898.
Contents: file consists of an ms. report submitted to the chairman and members of the Fire and Water Committee by W. Mahlon Davis, superintendent of the Berlin Water Works.

Series 3 : Board of Water Commissioners of the Town of Berlin

Board of Water Commissioners of the Town of Berlin. - 1899-1914, [ca. 1970]. - 0.5 cm.
The Berlin Water Commission was formed in 1899 when the Town of Berlin purchased the water works from the Berlin Water Works Company. The initial commissioners were: J.C. Breithaupt (chairman), H.J. Bowman (secretary), Mayor George Rumpel, John S. Anthes, and P.S. Lautenschlager. W. Mahlon Davis was the first superintendent of the water works, followed by Henry Hymmen in 1901. The Berlin Water Commission became the Kitchener Water Commission when the city changed its name in 1916. (Source: contents of the fonds.)
Contents: series consists of minutes of the Board of Water Commissioners for the town of Berlin, from the first meeting on January 4th, 1899, to May 30, 1914; and annual reports from 1899-1901.

Contents: file consists of a tender and a memorandum from R. Boehmer & Co. regarding the delivery of coal to a pump house.

Contents: file consists of a tender and an agreement regarding the supply of lead water services to the Berlin water works system by Peter Hymmen, plumber and hardware merchant.

Marcel Pequegnat, superintendent and clerk of the Kitchener Water Commission, received a subpoena as part of the proceedings. The water tower was constructed as planned.

Contents: file consists of a copy of a report prepared by the Kitchener Water Commission for the Ontario Department of Health. The information in the report was supplied and checked by Marcel Pequegnat.

(Kitchener, ON). Includes correspondence, tenders, guarantees, invoices, and a bond. Most correspondence is with Marcel Pequegnat, superintendent of the commission.

In 1948, a related organization, the Grand Valley Conservation Authority, was created and the two organizations operated independently until 1966 when they amalgamated to form the Grand River Conservation Authority.
