Pre-War

- there was no mention of anti-Mennonite feeling
- there was tension as the war progressed, and concern that the Mennonites be given CO status; were pleased when their leaders (eg. J.B. Martin, E.J. Swalm) returned from Ottawa with the news of the A.S.W. program

War

- expressed concern over a sense of responsibility to the country as well as God; in this sense, Brubacher was frustrated with his experiences in B.C., while Good felt that the work he had been involved in had been a worthwhile contribution
- when each of them left for B.C. they were under the impression that they would be there for the duration of the war
- had completely different camp experiences; generally speaking, Brubacher's were bad and Good's were good
- expressed concern for the active witness of those who do not go to war, instead of being hidden away
