Died 23 Apr. 1853; Aged 67 years.

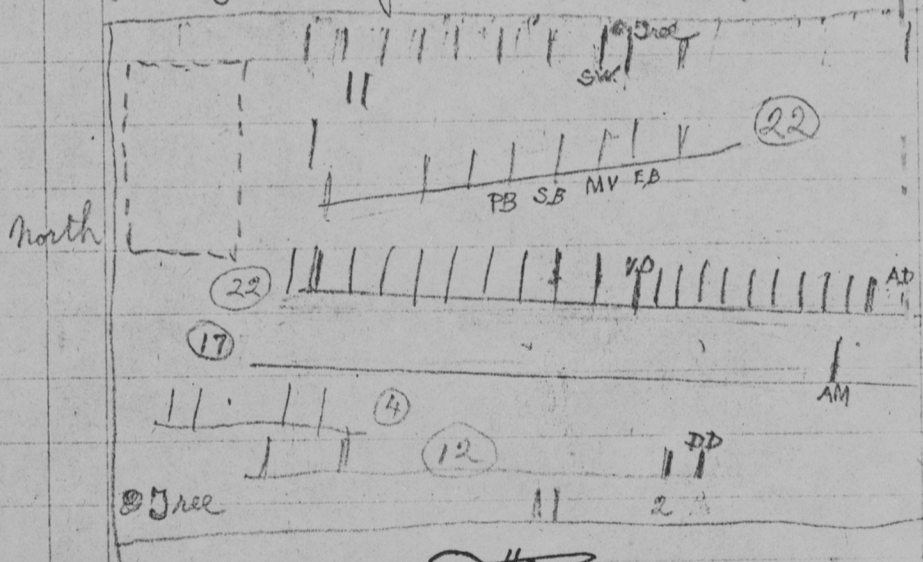
Rev. S. H. Brown (Samuel)  
Died 27 April 1881; Aged 87 years

Mary A. Venerable  
Died 10 Oct. 1881; Aged 79 years, 5 months.  
Her executors discharged a mortgage to Wm Lawson on 17th Decr, 1881

Ellen, wife of Rev. S. H. Brown  
Died 16 June 1887; Aged (?) years, 10 months, 6 days

Lies in 3rd row? from East & about midway between South side of church and southern  
limits of cemetery. She above lie all close by to the North of Ellen's grave.

The church building was sold & removed in the year 1934.



Wm Lawson died on 8th of Jan, 1899  
and was fifty years old in March, 1892.  
Mary Ann Venerable was the wife of  
Samuel Venerable, Guelph in 1874 and  
was formerly Mary Ann Pope

On Lot 17, Con. 4, Peel Twp, about half way back on east side of lot is a  
lost coloured graveyard once enclosed with pine board fence; on Amsey Martin farm  
A Mr. Harding and his wife were buried  
(coloured) On the Alex Farr farm, next occupied by Eli W Gingrich  
Across the road from the house on a knoll, lot 12, Con. 5, Peel Twp.  
Along On same side road, to the south, on lot 13, Con 7, " "  
about 2/3 way back to blind line is, a <sup>also</sup> coloured peoples' graveyard  
considered by above Alex Farr to have been once about 1/2 acre in size.
