June 3 to June 21, 2020 (approx. dates)

Experience the music and cultural life of Bali, Indonesia through concerts, workshops, traditional ceremonies, festivals, museums, cultural sites, and local cuisine.

This trip may be taken for credit as MUSIC 355.





#### Tentative Partial List of Activities

- Annual Bali Arts Festival opening ceremony and concerts

- Concerts of Balinese music and dance, including a mebarung at the Ardja Candra Amphitheatre
- Lecture demonstrations by distinguished scholars and renowned artists
- Music workshops of six different ensembles led by master artists
- Walking tours of traditional Balinese villages
- Tours of the Lata Mahosadi Museum of Indonesian musical instruments and other museums
- Excursions to the heart of Ubud the cultural centre of Bali
- Visits to the Sacred Monkey Forest Sanctuary and Royal Palace
- Traditional ceremonies and celebrations
- Guided walking tour of the majestic Pura Besakih Temple Complex
- Guided historical tour of the old colonial capital,
   Singaraja, located in North Bali
- Music performance with local ensembles
- Practical culture classes: cooking lesson, handicrafts workshop, and pakian adat workshop
- Visits to the studios of master instrument makers, mask carvers, and more
- A walk through the rice fields of Campuan Village

#### Course Credit

This course may be taken for credit or interest. Students taking MUSIC 355 – Music and Culture in Bali, Indonesia for credit need to register in the normal way for either Winter 2020 or Spring 2020. If you are not a student at the University of Waterloo, transfer credit to your home university is usually possible, and should be arranged through your home university.

#### Course Requirements

37.5% - Travel Course Preparation (pre-departure)

37.5% - Daily Journal/Paper kept during the trip

15% - Final Reflective Essay

10% - Participation (prior to, during, and after the trip)

#### Accommodation

Participants will stay in two centrally located 3-star hotels in Ubud and Lovina.

#### Program Cost\*

Students approx. \$1900 Community participants approx. \$2500

**Estimated fee includes:** accommodation, local transportation, admissions to concerts, museums, temples, cultural sites, lectures, workshops, special excursions, breakfasts, and six communal meals (lunch or dinner while in Bali).

\* NOTE: Fees subject to change

**Not included:** airfare, most lunches and dinners, medical insurance, vaccinations, tuition fee, optional activities, and personal expenses. An additional \$300 to 500 CAD in spending money is suggested.

Awards and financial aid are available to full-time students taking the course for credit. Submit a written request with your paper Registration Form or Webform.

#### Registration and Payment Schedule

Registration is limited to 12 participants and will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis, with priority given to students taking the course for credit. Each participant, whether or not registering for credit, needs to complete and submit the attached paper Registration Form or complete the Registration Webform.

- Deposit of \$500 is due at the time of registration
- Firm prices will be set January 15, 2020
- The balance is due February 15, 2020
