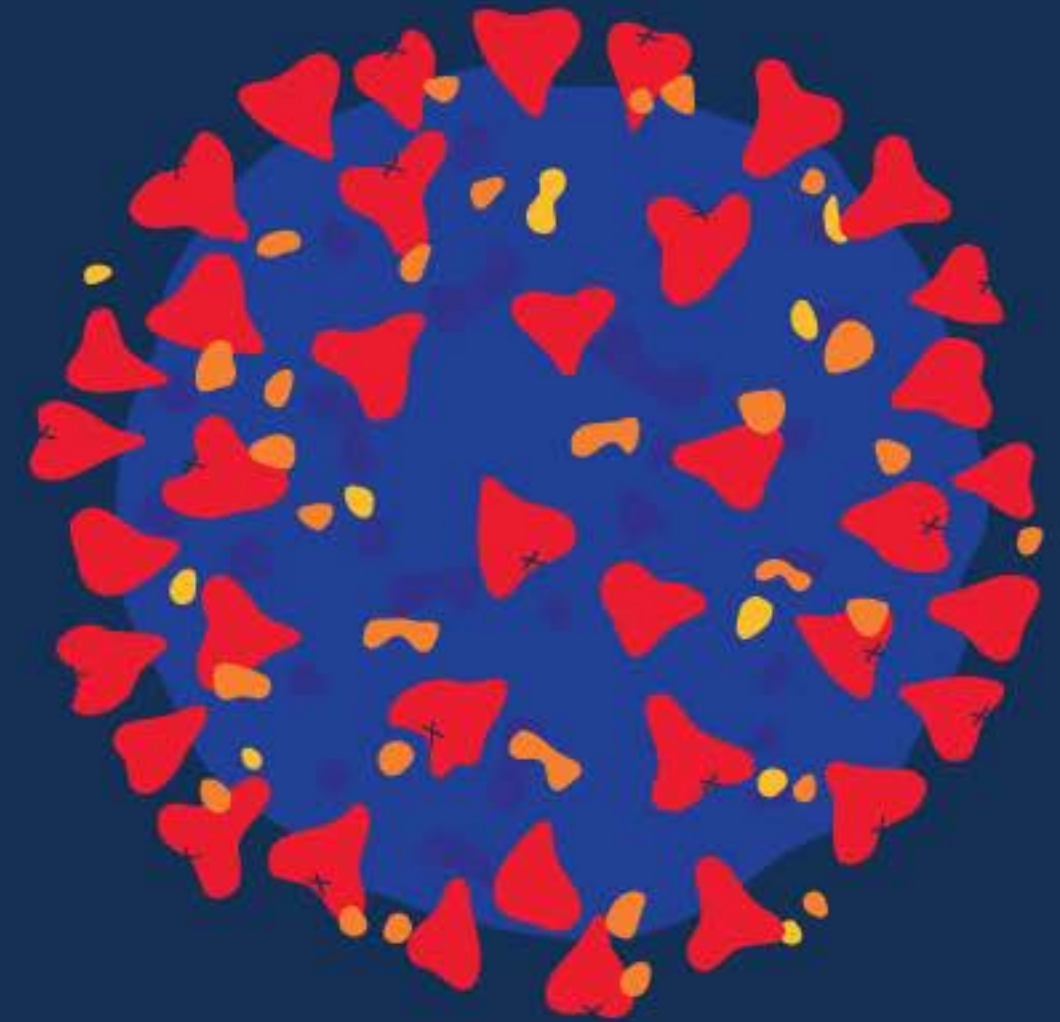


COVID-19

Learn what burnout looks like for you, so you can spot the signs early and take preventive action.



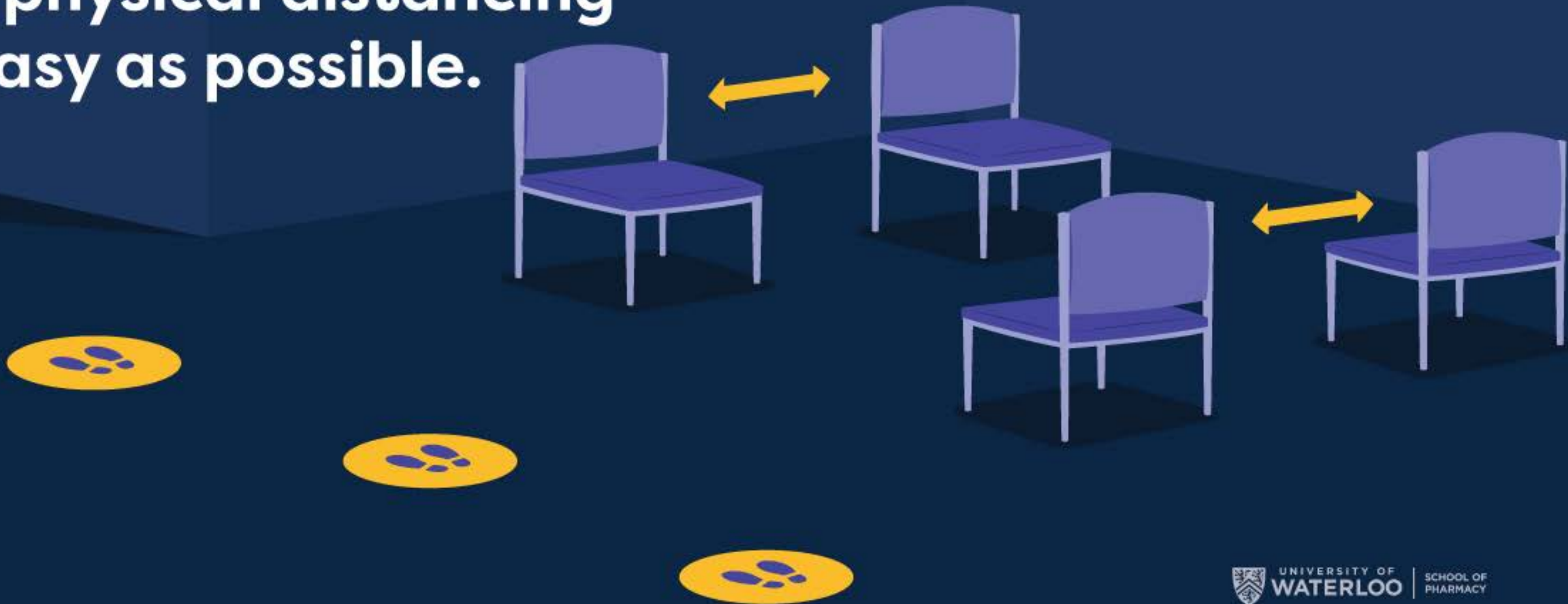
COVID-19

Giving flu shots? Plan ahead to make workflow and physical distancing as easy as possible.



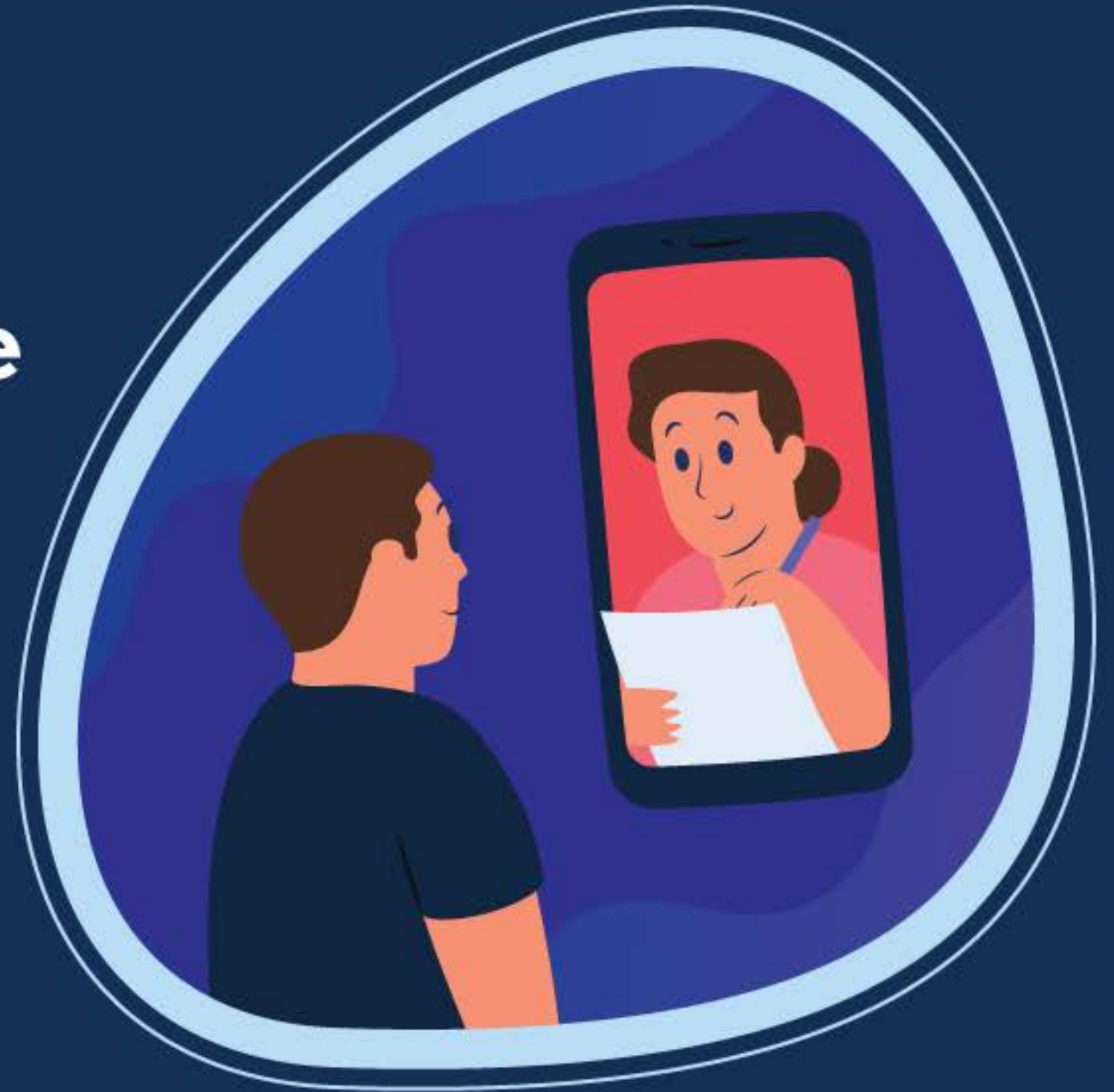
COVID-19
