

CO-OP PRACTICE SETTING REQUIREMENT

Requirement: Students must complete a minimum of two different practice settings over the course of three co-op work terms.

Types of practice settings:

- **1. Community** any community pharmacy position (independent or corporate chain) with a focus on distribution and/or direct patient care.
- **2. Hospital** any hospital position. Can be further divided but are not considered unique practice settings for the purpose of this requirement.
 - **a. Project** positions focused on project work (e.g. formulary review, drug utilization, safety projects).
 - **b.** Clinical positions in specific clinical areas where students engaged in activities such as completing BPMH, med recs, interviewing patients/family, bedside rounds, discharge counselling, chart reviews, etc. within the hospital (e.g. ASP, pre-op, oncology, inpatient units, critical care).
 - **c. Distribution** include mainly the distribution of medications in the inpatient pharmacy.
- 3. Ambulatory Care/Clinics positions where medical services are performed on an outpatient basis without admission to a hospital or LTC facility including Family Health Teams and Community Health Centres (e.g. hospital outpatient departments, specialty clinics such as dialysis or infusion, outpatient BPMH [LHSC], outpatient oncology [GRH, Sunnybrook]).
- **4. Long-Term Care** consultant or dispensing medication to predominantly nursing homes (e.g. Classic Care for nursing homes, Medical Pharmacies dispensary for LTC).
- **5. Head Office** positions within an organization's head office (e.g. Costco, Walmart, or Whole Health Pharmacy Partners Head Office).
- **6. Academic/Research** –positions in an academic unit or organization with a focus on research (e.g. ISMP, McMaster, UWaterloo).
- **7. Pharmaceutical Industry** –positions in the pharmaceutical industry (e.g. Canadian Hospital Specialties, Baxter, Novocol, Glaxo).
- **8. Professional Association** –positions with a regulatory college or professional association (e.g. CPhA, OCP, CSHP, NB College of Pharmacists).
- **9. Government/Military** –positions within government organizations (e.g. Ministry of Health, Health Canada, Canadian Armed Forces).
- **10. Health Technology/Virtual Care** positions with a strong technology focus, including app development, telemedicine, and telehealth (e.g. MedEssist, Conversation Health, MedMe).
- **11. Other** any positions that don't fit into the categories above.
