



Frequently asked questions about naloxone

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The goal of this informational series is to increase pharmacists' knowledge on the frequently asked questions about naloxone, so that they can fill their own knowledge gaps as well as the knowledge gaps of their patients. Pharmacists are key to ensuring all at risk of opioid overdose or who are in a position to help have naloxone and know how to use it. Beyond the signs and symptoms of opioid toxicity, naloxone administration, and the importance of calling 911, pharmacists can also be a resource for emerging research about naloxone and countering myths about naloxone.
