# Constitution

## of the Physics Graduate Student Association at the University of Waterloo

## 1 General information / objectives

- 1. To foster a collegial environment for graduate students to learn, and collaborate with other members of the University of Waterloo (UW) community.
- 2. This club agrees to adhere to the stated regulations of the University of Waterloo Graduate Student Association (UW GSA), and also in accordance with University Policy 33.

#### 2 Executive positions / responsibilities

- 1. All officers must be enrolled as students in the Department of Physics and Astronomy at the University of Waterloo.
  - (a) Chair. This position is responsible for leading the Physics GSA, making decisions that will guide the organization, and develop it's long term objectives.
  - (b) Clerk. This official takes minutes and keeps official documents.
  - (c) Treasurer. This person keeps track of monetary assets, and maintains the associations records.
  - (d) UW GSA Council Representative. The councillor meets once a month with the Graduate Student Association to discuss and vote on academic issues, policies, social events, lobby efforts and issues related to graduate student funding.
- 2. Executive members must carry out duties with integrity, honouring the principles of morality, honesty, fairness and good character.

#### 3 Description of membership

1. All students enrolled in the Department of Physics and Astronomy at the University of Waterloo are general members.

#### 4 Election / rules

- 1. The UW Physics GSA executives are responsible for running annual elections
  - (a) In the event of a re-election, a nonpartisan UW Physics GSA member may run the election.
  - (b) Elections take place at the annual general meeting (AGM).
  - (c) The UW Physics GSA will nominate one graduate student member to serve as a representative for the UW GSA.
- 2. Executive positions are held for 1 year after the date of election.

## 5 Constitution / documents / meetings

- 1. Quorum is attained if at least 1/4 of all general members and 1 executive member are present, OR if all the executive members are present at a meeting.
- 2. This constitution shall be made available to all members of the UW Physics GSA.
  - (a) Amendments to the constitution can be made with a minimum 2/3 majority vote of all (general and executive) members in attendance of any valid meeting. This meeting shall be advertised to all members of the UW Physics GSA, with a notice of intention to amend the constitution, at least 2 weeks prior to the meeting.
- 3. Archives shall be kept with administrative persons in the Department of Physics and Astronomy, or with the UW GSA.
