Undergraduate Specialization in International Relations

These two specializations (open to all Four-Year General or Honours Political Science Students) provide students with the opportunity to undertake an intensive program of study in global politics, international relations and global governance.

MA & PhD Program in Global Governance

Global Governance entails an interdisciplinary examination of the variety of actors, institutions, ideas, rules, and processes that contribute to the management of global society. Drawing on a variety of disciplines, including economics, political science and history, the programs integrate the concepts, tools and assumption that have served scholars in the past and assess new approaches more suited to addressing contemporary and future challenges.

Balsillie Fellowships valued at \$15,000 (for master's) and \$25,000 (for doctoral) annually will be awarded to graduate students who satisfy the eligibility requirements for the University of Waterloo Graduate Scholarship. The recipients of the Balsillie Doctoral Fellowship will be expected to involve themselves in research and policy-oriented CIGI events pertaining to their work.
