CERTIFICATE

Undergraduate students at Waterloo can earn a certificate that counts toward their degree. Students must successfully complete the required number of courses and meet the cumulative average.

- **CERTIFICATE IN JAPANESE LANGUAGE I**
(four courses in level 100 or 200, cumulative average 70%)
- **CERTIFICATE IN JAPANESE LANGUAGE II**
(four courses in level 200 or 300, cumulative average 70%)

DIPLOMA

Students enrolled in a non-degree or post-degree academic plan at Waterloo are eligible to earn a diploma.

- **DIPLOMA IN JAPANESE LANGUAGE**
(six JAPAN courses, cumulative average 65%)

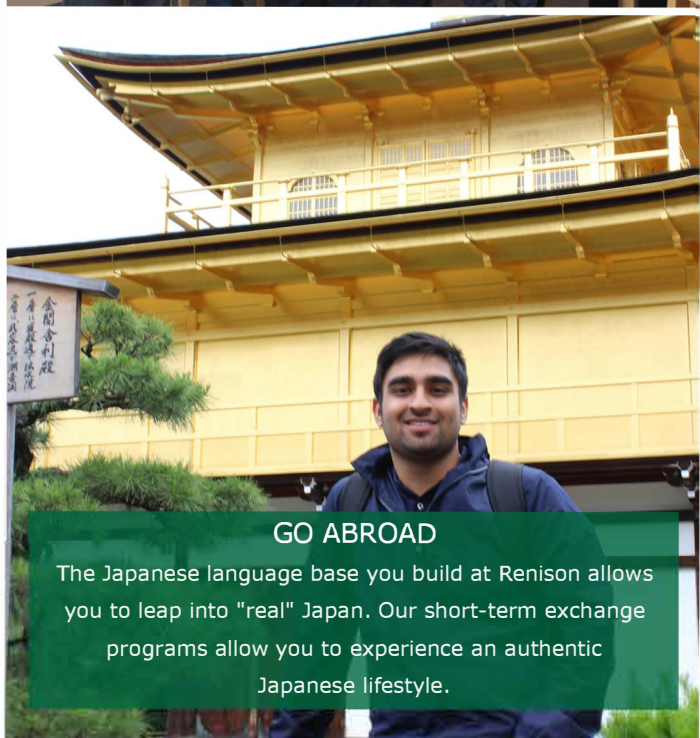
