Disposal Instructions

Batteries

Disposal of batteries occurs in different locations depending on the battery type.



Lithium and rechargeable batteries MUST have their ends taped and/or be individually bagged to reduce fire risk (bags are available at the battery collection points).

WASTE	EXAMPLES	DISPOSAL INSTRUCTIONS
Small electronic waste	 Used writing utensils Cell phones Small e-waste (e.g., mice, keyboards, peripherals) 	 Can be disposed of at an e-waste drop off location: SLC Lower Atrium DC Library (adjacent to the front entrance) Central Stores (ECH) Vapes and e-cigarettes are not accepted as e-waste.
Ink and toner cartridges	 Office printer ink replacement cartridges 	Must be placed in a box sealed with tape or bagged to prevent leakage. Can be placed at department mail stops or in an e- waste drop-off location (see above).
Large electronic waste	ComputersMonitorsTVs	Can be disposed of directly at Central Stores (ECH) or contact <u>Sean Kimpinski</u> to arrange pickups for larger items.

Notes for Household E-waste, Research Equipment and Vapes/E-cigarettes

Household E-waste is Accepted

Research Equipment

Research equipment that either contains liquids or has a value of \$20,000 or greater will have to follow the <u>asset disposal process</u> prior to being received as electronic waste.

Vapes and E-cigarettes Cannot be Recycled at the University

Users should contact the store that they purchased from as many stores offer recycling programs through the manufacturers. Additionally, individuals can sign up for <u>Terracycle's</u> free vape cartridge recycling program.
