# **Meeting Minutes**

### 1. Executive, Faculty and Departmental Updates

- Science Society
  - By-elections underway; results expected imminently.
  - Winter term cheques anticipated by the end of May or first week of June.
    Executives are advised to follow up if delayed.
  - Issues identified regarding carryover funds:
    - Funds from previous terms not properly reflected in accounts.
    - The WUSA accountant has not applied the carryover from the previous two terms and therefore the carryover is not reflected properly.

- May have resulted from possible errors in the spreadsheets sent by prior VP Finance (VPF).
- Current co-VPFs are working on auditing and revising financial records thoroughly.

### Biochemistry Student Association (BSA)

- Executive hiring ongoing.
- Event planning is progressing steadily.

### Biomedical Student Association (BMSA)

- Executive hiring completed.
- o Preparing to release "Meet the Team" content.

## • Biology Undergraduate Student Society (BUGS)

- o Off to a strong start as a tentative budget has been prepared for the term.
- o The BUGS team has met to discuss expectations for the term.

## • Chemistry Club (ChemClub)

- Completed their budget.
- Review sessions planned.
- Preparing for constitution updates.

# Materials & Nanoscience Society (MNS)

- o First club meeting held.
- Ongoing event planning.

## • Physics Undergraduate Society (PhysClub)

- o Budget has been finalized for the term.
- Currently onboarding executives and planning events.

## • Science and Business Student Association (SBSA)

- o The team is fully hired.
- First internal meeting scheduled for Thursday, May 29.
- Brainstorming and development of event plans is underway.
- Working on setting up consistent office hours.

## Earth and Environmental Undergraduate Club (WATROX)

- Held first club meeting.
- Planned out their budget.
- Currently finalizing event dates.

## • Faculty/Science Undergraduate Office (SUO)

- Tamara DeSouza
  - Will be the main contact for the department clubs due to her role as the Student Engagement Officer at SUO.
  - Any questions, comments and concerns can be directed to Tamara.
- o Kayla Bunde
  - Is the current student transition coordinator.
  - Role is shifting to help with Science Orientation.

- She will be aiding with Orientation programming.
- SciSoc will be participating in orientation efforts this year.

## 2. Spring Budget Review

- Biochemistry Student Association (BSA)
  - Budget generally follows previous terms:
    - Frequent Snack and Study sessions (\$120)
    - Milk & cookies events (\$100)
    - Several review sessions will be held throughout the term where pizza is the primary cost
    - Office supplies (\$50)
    - Ice cream event (\$140)
      - Hosted last term as well.
      - · Based on the budget from Spring 2024.
    - Departmental Club Bonfire event (\$30)
  - During discussion:
    - VPF raised questions about the Ice Cream event budget and where the allocation of funds originated from.
      - Response: Previous term actuals were referenced for allocations.
    - VPF recommended adding approximately \$100 into discretionary as contingency.
  - Total discretionary funds increased by \$100 during the meeting.
  - Planning collaboration event with the Chem Grad Student Society (CGSS); CGSS may cover costs for that collaboration.

## Biomedical Student Association (BMSA)

- BMSA mentions they did overshoot for some numbers, rather safe that sorry
- Asrith asks: Paint a Petri dish; do they need to buy paint supplies?
  - Suggests that SciSoc has a lot of paint supplies that other clubs can use; rather than spending, advises clubs to share resources, or ask SciSoc for some?
- SciSoc will take inventory of what they have and will post in BOD channel when possible

#### Biology Undergraduate Student Society (BUGS)

- Overshoot for many prices just in case
- Gave most budget to EOT since they expect most turn out
  - Asrith and Parth suggest increasing \$\$ because of rising food prices OR shifting more into discretionary
- Chemistry Club (ChemClub)

- Office supplies; ChemClub plans to update inventory and textbooks, a good chunk of budget going towards that; subject to change though
  - Depends on what is in stock, and what they need.
  - Asrith: will people really use textbooks?
    - Yes, they do use the textbooks at times! Asrith did suggest that after meeting ChemClub could go to SciSoc and check the chem books to see if they could use any.
- o For collab bonfire, allocated \$30; but added \$20 just in case needed
- Plans to host CHEM review sessions as well

# Materials & Nanoscience Society (MNS)

- Allocating some money for machine renewals like kettle and coffee.
- They are changing their food during game night and make it snacks instead resulting into lower allocation however they are overshooting just in case
- Asrith asked where the printing material is coming from
  - Scisoc can provide printer paper as they do have a lot so they don't have to use this budget from their account

### Physics Undergraduate Society (PhysClub)

- Typical breakdown taken straight from the spreadsheet!
- Has 10 water guns already, going to buy 12 more
- Tesla coil lab can only accommodate 25 people; are going to have sign up sheets
- Clubs are not permitted to change anything on finance spreadsheets after this BOD. In order to change any values, they must contact SciSoc VPFs.

#### Science and Business Student Association (SBSA)

- Typical office supplies breakdown (snacks, materials etc.)
- Summer social since there have been many program changes
- Midterm care packages are popular, making for x50 people
- Therapy Dogs with colouring
  - Only \$\$ is for buying the parking tickets, \$25 just in case
- EOT Campfire; planning to put \$100 towards that
  - Asrith suggests that SciSoc funds the whole thing, and the clubs just host it.
    - Otherwise, there would be so many cheques flying around; makes sense to just have SciSoc cover it?

## • Earth and Environmental Undergraduate Club (WATROX)

- Typical thorough breakdown of the sheet.
- Consider a contract while doing a collab for easier and better planning between parties involved.

- Making some changes in terms of adding 50\$ in discretionary
- Eot event lowered from 675\$ to 300\$

## Moving \$\$ for all club bonfires to the discretionary

- SciSoc will cover the collaborative bonfire; all clubs move the allocated funds to their discretionary
  - MNS requests funds go to merch instead (stickers)

#### 3. CnD New Direction Proposal

- VPF had a meeting with WUSA Operations last week to discuss plans for CnD moving forward.
- As of right now, Science CnD will remain closed for Spring 2025 term, with goal of reopening after orientation (~1-2 weeks into Fall 2025)
- WUSA Operations introduced the idea of potentially automating CnD (ie. self service and automated inventory; similar to PHARM self serve)
  - Will be on a trust basis
  - Why automation and not workers? The cost of hiring someone to work there part time is higher than the potential loss from theft (according to WUSA Operations)
  - Will still keeping the brand of Science CnD, however all self serve / inventory will be under WUSA
    - Inventory will be based on top sellers in Flock Stop; use WUSA analytics to stock shelves and ensure goods are sold.
  - Hot foods will not be provided 24/7 but only when volunteers are available on site
- Some clubs raise concerns about:
  - BUGS: automation taking potential jobs from Science students
    - Asrith has answered that SciSoc is barely breaking even; at the moment it does not financially make sense to hire.
  - Physclub: losing that sense of CnD community, and increasing prices?
    - SciSoc mentioned we can have volunteers still present to interact with students, also prices will not be increasing
    - Additionally, this will be less work for the volunteers; they can just hang out in CnD
  - What is the point of VPR?
    - SciSoc mentions that they (VPR) will still be in charge of inventory, volunteer management, WUSA communications in regards to CnD etc.

- There are also many other responsibilities that VPRs have, like merch etc.
- SciSoc clarified that this idea is still in the discussion phase and has not been confirmed; the intention is to gather student feedback and begin exploring the concept.
  - Overall, clubs expressed interest in receiving more information. While no strong opposition was voiced, there is a general desire for further details before forming an opinion.

#### 4. Final Remarks

- BOD is next week as well but bi-weekly going forward!
- For BOD of June 16 (tentatively SVPRO training), details will be shared later on when we have more information.
  - o Top 3 are needed in attendance, other execs are welcomed as well
- Moving forward, at least one exec must be present in person at BOD for better communication
