- 1. Move to moderated caucus to recall the motion to approve the 2019 Spring Term Coordinators appointed by the Executive.

 - o Approved by the BOD.

- 2. Move to discuss the current Board of Directors meeting arrangements and potential alternatives. Call to nominate new meeting arrangements. Move to agree on a new meeting arrangement for all future Board of Directors' meetings this term.
 - A link will be posted by the president to see when the meetings should be held. Should be posted tonight
- 3. BOT Event Planning.
 - Collaboration within the interdepartmental clubs last year
 - o Booked out the earth sciences museum
 - o Many people came to the event and the cost was split between the clubs
 - o \$50 each club
 - Does not have to be the exact same as last term, please contribute ideas
 - Questions that were asked
 - o How much will of the budget will it cost?
 - Spring budget is not as big as the Fall and Winter terms. We will look at how much each club wanted to spend
 - Approximating \$50 per club
 - Event will probably take place in the end of May
 - Speaker moved to call recess. Recess called at 7:25PM for 5 minutes to discuss the event planning. Recess extended until 7:35PM
 - Speaker moved to discuss the ideas about BOT from the members. Seconded by the President
 - All in favour
 - 0 opposed
 - 0 abstained
 - Floor is open for discussion
 - o Reasonable cost minimum \$60 budget and BUGS is open for collaboration
 - o ChemClub is on the fence and leaning to their own event
 - Pizza night with board games and movies
 - o Watrox is also leaning towards a no
 - Even 50 dollars is a lot coming from the budget and think it would not be beneficial for their club members

- o BUGS suggestions
 - lemonade stands
 - Something like a beach day
 - Advertising to more people to come to their events
 - It is an easy way to introduce them to the clubs
 - Suggesting giving out free stuff
 - Treating Science students differently vs non-science students
 - Thinking of having an open space for the event, something like last year where we use the museum
- Speaker moved to talk about this matter at a later date
 - All in favour
 - 0 opposed
 - 0 abstained
- 4. Approval of permanent Aviation Society student funding
- Over the last year for the fall and winter terms. They gave them 4 dollars per students to fund their events and society. As long as they used their funds appropriately, they would be given funding.
 - o Aviation society was created last year for the Aviation program within the faculty of science
 - o Their memorandums of understanding are posted under their website which also have their events and other information
 - Represent 200 students, 80 students came to events and they also had a lecture by Chris Hadfield
 - They had multiple panels with pilots from major airlines and pilots from the
 - 160 people attended the aviation gala
 - The VPFA attended the event and she talked to first years. Most of them said that they would go to the event again
 - Many major aviation companies were present
 - The President of UW was also present along with the mayor of Waterloo
 - Industry companies sponsored the event (6 sponsors). 50/50 geo and science students
 - They currently get 4 dollars per student. They would also like SciSoc to fund their club.
 - They would like to see if the funding could be made permanent as their events have been successful
- Move to fund 4 dollars person student. Moved by the speaker and seconded by BUGS
- Approved by the BOD
 - All in favour
 - 0 opposed
 - 0 abstained

Open floor

- Still navigating through this time of the term as there was a lot of turnover within SciSoc.
 - o Helping coordinators become more informed about their roles etc.
- Needs to be a comfortable environment for everyone to discuss and raise their concerns
