  - Oz (Physics Club): We have more books and we need more space
- Zahra Hasan (VPI): Why is there no budget accounted for the BOT Bond-Fire collaborative event?
  - Noura (Physics Club): We have not updated that yet, we haven't had our meeting with all of the Physics Club executives to finalize our budget.
- Zahra Hasan (VPI): Can you explain the breakdown for budgeting \$800 for student prof night?
  - Morgan (BSA): Physics has significantly higher representation because two terms of physics students are present in this spring term while every other department only has one term present
  - Oz (Physics Club): turn out for the student prof night is very good every time, the lowest

number is 87 students but it ranges from 87-130 students

- We also have professors represented from other clubs and we always collaborate with other clubs like MNS, etc.
- Celine (Chem Club): we typically do Huether Hotel but we can look into other cheaper options so it can be a better
- Morgan (BSA): we should only comment on whether it is worth it this term not the actual money in the term, I believe we always do it because it always brings such value to students to networking for biochemistry and chemistry
  - Chemistry because we have mandatory research project, meeting with them is beneficial, can be our supervisors and it is very valuable
  - Learning that professors are approachable after class and outside class to get help is very helpful - Student Prof night have a very big impact on the people that do go
- Oz (Physics Club): And people enjoy these events
  - All these events we listed, 90% are guaranteed in turnout because of previous terms
- Zahra Hasan (VPI): What is Astrofire?
  - Oz (Physics Club): Astrofire is a recurring event for 5 years since PhysClub came back
    - Details: event is sitting around a campfire and looking at stars
- Veronica Chan (P): Amend the motion to postpone approval of the budget next BOD meeting when everything is finalized since you said that you were finalizing details later with your team tomorrow.

- Alyssa (VPAF): We do not include merchandise in the 70% spending for the budget, therefore it is not 87% but 77% of their budget that SBSA is projected to spend

- Why is it \$200 for the budget
  - For drink and food tickets
  - Cater to all science students but focusing on science and business students
  - Minimum of 80-90 people → headcount page have 200-230 people
  - Include biotech CPA, etxc.
- Zahra Hasan (VPI): Professional photoshoots why do you need \$50? Where is the \$50 of the Professional Photoshoot's money being spent
  - Jeremy Li (SBSA): we plan to have food and refreshments but we know Science Society is also having a professional photoshoot so we would be open to collaboration
  - If we don't need \$50 for our professional photoshoot, then we would allocate the \$50 to our study event for refreshments
- Alyssa Huang (VPFA): Why are you spending \$200 for your midterm breakfast event?
  - Jeremy Li (SBSA): We typically spend \$400 for that event but since it is Spring Term and there are less people, we are trying to cut it down to \$200
  - Not only, we don't only open our events to Science and Business students, but all science students
- Evan Chang (BUGS): How was attendance at past EOTs?
  - Jeremy Li (SBSA): We have around 100 people show up
  - Even if 40 people show up, it would be \$5 per person
- Jeremy Li (SBSA): We have \$0 placed into marketing because online marketing works really well for our target audience of Science and Business students
  - Alyssa Huang (VPAF): Suggest to move to put some budget at marketing to be more accessible to other science students because we want to try to reach out to all science students
  - Jeremy Li (SBSA): I agree
- Zahra Hasan (VPI): I move to amend the SBSA Budget to move \$50 budget for the professional photoshoot to other events and to increase funding for marketing, because SciSoc wants to collaborate with SBSA for this event. - Celine (Chem Club): Science Society Wonderland Bus Trip Budget results in the society spending \$28/student for only 45 students which is a huge amount of the budget to spend on solely 45 students. I propose that we increase the ticket price to \$40 per student so that it will be around \$16/student.
- Veronica Chan (P): I am fine with increasing the ticket price to \$40 per student. To clarify, the bus prices went up by a couple hundred dollars, so even if we increase the ticket price to \$40, it will still be around \$23/student
- Celine (Chem Club): I am not okay with that, that is too much money spent per student.
- Zahra Hasan (VPI): It is not part of the constitution or policy and procedure to spend only \$16/student. If you feel that you have been pressured to create events centered around this idea, let us know and we can definitely discuss further.
- Veronica Chan (P): Our goal is to put on good events for Science Students and improve student experience. I would like some time to find cheaper alternatives as the Wonderland Bus Trip has been an annual event for a long time and many students look forward to attending this event.
- Veronica Chan: I move to amend the Science Society Budget to find cheaper alternatives for the Wonderland Bus Trip or propose alternative ways to redirect funding to planned events to improve the quality or increase the number of events. I move to approve of the Science Society Budget contingent on this amendment at the next BOD meeting.
